

Why Do We Need DIL?

Millions of children in Pakistan do not attend school. Fewer than half of all eligible children are enrolled, and those who attend are taught by poorly trained teachers. School buildings are dilapidated or non-existent and many lack basic furnishings of functioning classrooms. Due to these conditions 49% of the population cannot read or write and are stuck in a cycle of poverty.

What is DIL's Approach?

Quality education assured through on-going teacher development equips children with the knowledge, attitudes and skills needed to reach their potential and contribute to the betterment of their communities.

Educate a Child: We provide quality education based on the world's best teaching practices that are adapted to the rural Pakistani context.

Nurture a Dream: Our student-centered approach to education emphasizes critical thinking skills, equips students to succeed in the global marketplace and turn dreams of a brighter future into reality.

Develop a Teacher: The DIL Teacher Education Development Center builds the capacity of educators by providing on-going teacher training tailored to the needs of the rural teacher.

Build a Community: We build strong, long-standing relationships with local communities, encourage participation and inspire sustainable change.

How is DIL Making an Impact?

After 14 years of building teacher capacity and educating children, we are beginning to see the broader social impact of our work.
