Originally founded in 2008, 826DC

(formerly Capitol Letters Writing Center) is the newest affiliate in the 826 National network, co-founded by award-winning author Dave Eggers and educator Ninive Calegari. On October 23, 2010, we opened our first permanent home, and within the first year had nearly quadrupled the number of students we served. In SY2013-14, we served 3,369 students across the District of Columbia.

# Financial stability and sustainability

Over the next three years, 826DC will focus on building our general operating reserve, paying down our debt, and developing a sustainable and stable fundraising base.

## Program Demand and Organizational Capacity

826DC has a small staff – four FT and one PT employees, one Public Ally, and an AmeriCorps VISTA member. We have aggressive program growth goals, and in doing so we need to build our staff and our board, as well as diversify and expand our volunteer base.
