Out of a place riddled with crime, violence, substance abuse, unemployment and poverty due to many years of apartheid oppression and discrimination emerged a young man, Glen Steyn, who single handedly initiated innovative approaches to the complex problems facing his community of Westbury.

In the year of 1995, Conquest for Life was born.

Over the past 12 years, Conquest for Life has made a difference not only in Westbury but also in the other disadvantaged communities, of Soweto, Ennerdale, Orange Farm and now Reiger Park.

Although the young people of these varied communities represent different cultures, the disparities are prevalent cross-culturally. The lack of supportive role models has led to relationship problems. The youth have to cope with life coming from dysfunctional homes and families.

Many of the young people have difficulty adjusting to school and drop out before matric. As a result they lack the life skills needed to adjust to structured environments and to develop positive relationships.

Conquest For Life empowers the youth through the following programmes:

Youth Enrichment Programme (YEP)
Safe after care environments for children aged 5-14yrs; holiday camps;
Just for kids (JFK)



CHRONICLES OF CONQUEST

Life orientation courses run in the local schools.
Youth At Risk (YAR)

Three week camps where the participants are offered mentorship programmes, diversion projects and activities that help them focus on goals that they are motivated to meet.

Men for life: Creating a better environment by working alongside young men giving support where needed.

Young Mothers Project (YMP)
Empowers and supports young women and their families

Computer Training Centre: Certificated course in Computer literacy.

Reathusana Child Youth Justice Project: Targeting under 18 awaiting trial young offenders with the aim of rehabilitating the

Incarcerated.

Siyasizana Project

Focusing on the arts and culture for all the youth and children in the communities

My Father's House:

Instilling a sense of responsibility in the young men by enriching their lives through education and self empowerment. These young men run a home for HIV/AIDS orphans and vulnerable children.
Exchange Programme (see volunteers)

Conquest for Life's target group includes the unemployed, out of school youth, youth in conflict with the law, parents, and mentors who are caring people in the community.

Westbury Head Office

The driving engine – Established in 1995 with the inception of Conquest For Life. The branch moved to larger premises in Newclare in 1999.

As the hub of CFL, it is where the action never stops. Day by day, there is a continual flow of people through the office including the children who attempt

to take over in the afternoon before settling down to a structured aftercare programme including arts, computer training and assistance with homework.

All the administration is controlled at the Head Office and our Mexican Volunteer – Carlos is implementing an intranet network where all the reports will be

easy to be produced and information readily available.

The whole team gather weekly for meetings and workshops where the ongoing programmes are assessed and evaluated. These weekly meetings motivate and unite the team in working towards the fulfilment of Conquest for Life's Goal.

Ennerdale Branch

The Ennerdale Branch was established in August 2002. It started as a small office at the civic centre and since then we have worked hard and have managed to secure bigger premises.

Conquest For Life has a partnership with various organizations including the Jo'burg Social Development. Under the leadership of Branch Manager Lefa Ramakgula, we have seen major new developments as the team strives for success.

It makes us happy to see the children interacting and playing.

Worth mentioning is the change in a very quiet, shy 11 year old girl, Clarice into a vivid and happy young lady. Since attending the Aftercare programme Clarice started to interact far more, communicate freely and now even dances with the children.

Her mother came personally to thank the team for their support and positive development.

Soweto Branch

The Soweto branch was launched in February 2003. In the early stages of establishment, the branch ran three programmes, Just For Kids Peace Games, Aftercare Program and Youth At Risk.

Our biggest challenge in Soweto was to find appropriate space. During March 2004, through engaging in various meetings with role players of the different communities in Soweto (the council, the schools, Gauteng officials etc) we

managed to secure office space in the Meadowlands Zone 10 Community Multi Purpose Hall.

In 2007, we moved to a house in Meadowlands Zone 9. The advancement of this programme is due to the dedicated staff under the able leadership of Bafana Nkosi.

Today Computer Training, Diversion for the young criminals and the Young Mothers programme has been added to their list of commitments.

Orange Farm Branch

Conquest For Life had a partnership with the Masibambane College and used to run its operation from the college at the Vienna Centre.

The latest achievement of Conquest For Life was the opening of our own office in Orange Farm.

Situated in the heart of Orange Farm, an informal settlement about 55km south of Johannesburg, the office runs almost all the Conquest for Life projects.

All the Conquest for Life projects are run at Orange Farm. The offices have been plagued by robberies where the computers, office equipment and even the food have been taken which has set the continuity of the projects back.

Conquest For Life is going to market its identity, set its own track record focusing on its own corporate identity as well as the brand of the Organization. We hope that this will expose to the community the good work done at the centre and that they will support and protect the branch from further robberies.

Reiger Park Branch

Our newest project is our fifth office on the East Rand in Boksburg. The different programmes will be run from a double store house. We are presently enrolling children for the Aftercare and the Just For Kids program is being introduced to the local schools.

We foresee that as these projects get up and running, we will recruit more staff and eventually be able to run all the other programmes as well.
