Where our multifaceted programs are concentrated, NEF celebrated the holy month of Ramadan and following Eid al Fiter feast in the "cluster" of nine villages northwest of Nablus, conducting a broad campaign of food distribution. Again NEF teamed with Human Concern International. Poor families received about 500 food packages and 570 packages of dairy products, while 400 packages of sweets went to kindergarten children.

Selected locations were agricultural communities suffering high unemployment: Aseera Alshamalya, Ignisieya, Nusf Ijbeel, Biet Umreen, products, while 400 packages of sweets Yaseed, Al Bathan, Talouza, Sabastiya and Burqa. All have been hard hit by price reductions for their produce and increased costs for raw materials due to Israeli closure policies in the Palestinian Territories.
