

OUR MISSION

Hidden Acres Thoroughbred Rescue (HATBR) is a non-profit 501c3 organization founded to promote the physical and emotional well-being of thoroughbreds that are retiring from the racetrack. We do this by fostering horses and placing them with loving owners, raising awareness on the cruel fates many of these horses face after the track, and raising the funds we need to feed and care for them, and to fund the adoption process and ensure a suitable match is made between horse and rider.

THE NEED

Each year, 30,000 to 40,000 horses are slaughtered and processed for human and pet consumption throughout the world - 60% of these horses originated from the racing industry. In the United States, more than 10,000 thoroughbreds are shipped annually to slaughterhouses in Canada and Mexico.

Many thoroughbreds going for meat are actually well bred, expensive horses that have literally given their heart to the sport, trainers, and owners that are so easily forsaking them. By and large,

racehorses don't retire to green pasture if they don't win; they mostly go to a slaughter auction.

And if slaughtering an animal of such athletic majesty is not bad enough, the means to the end are just as heartbreaking. Horses are sent to slaughterhouses in cramped trailers, usually without access to water or food. Injuries are common. Despite being banned by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, many horses continue to be shipped in double-decker trailers designed for cattle or sheep, vehicles not remotely tall enough for horses.

A University of California, Davis study of 306 horses destined for slaughter found that 60 of them sustained serious injuries during transport. And if they are lucky enough to arrive unharmed, at slaughter, these compelling competitors with uncommon courage are reduced to thrashing about to avoid a pneumatic gun that renders them unconscious before their throat is slit.

Some thoroughbreds are simply abandoned, left on vacant land to die a slow, painful death from thirst and hunger.

HIDDEN ACRES LAST CHANCE FOR THOROUGHBREDS

Hidden Acres Thoroughbred Rescue received its non-profit status in 2011 but

h e founder Susanna Norris and her twin sister Shannon have been rehabilitating off the track thoroughbreds for over 20 years. They have loved and nurtured dozens of horses for personal enjoyment, many of which have become successful hunter, jumper, and event horses.

It was a natural progression to open the doors of Suzanna's own Hidden Acres Equestrian Center to care for and rehabilitate these horses in need on a much larger scale. In December 2010, , Hidden Acres began officially fostering retired off the track thoroughbreds for FL TRAC, a volunteer-ran thoroughbred retirement and placement program dedicated specifically to racehorses with careers from Calder Race Course and Gulfstream Park (fltrac.org). By forming our own 501c3, Hidden Acres Thoroughbred Rescue works alongside FL TRAC in hopes of ensuring the vast numbers of horses coming from Calder and Gulfstream Park racetracks would have a guaranteed second chance at life.

In 2011, our first year of operation, we were able to adopt out 13 thoroughbreds to loving homes. Our goal in 2012 is to triple that!
