This is our first Annual Report. This report is part of an on-going project by the Children's House of Peace ("CCHP") to improve transparency & governance and I am very proud that through the hard work of our staff and volunteers, we can provide you with this new insight into our operations.

2012 was, in many ways, a challenging year for CCHP. Despite strong support from friends, overall donations fell sharply and at times I feared that we would be unable to meet our expenses. Unfortunately this meant we were forced to reduce staff, close our Youth House and make significant additional cost reductions. We were also deeply saddened by the passing of Un Chanrotha, our Director of Education and close friend. We are eternally grateful that we were blessed with his hard work, commitment and passion in building CCHP, and we miss him deeply.

At the same time, 2012 provided happiness and gratitude. We converted our boys' home into a stable concrete building (where the roof does not leak), upgraded our beds to wooden bunks and provided sanitized water for our kitchen. In 2012, we became present on social media through our Facebook page and initiated our monthly newsletter. As I look forward to 2013, my heart is full of optimism about building a better future for CCHP.

On behalf of our children and staff I would like to thank you sincerely. It is only with your generous support that we can continue to enrich the lives of children in Cambodia and fulfill our vision "to provide growth in body, mind and spirit for vulnerable children in a community of peace".
