

The Opportunity Scholarship:


- » Guides students toward STEM and health care pathways.

The Opportunity Scholarship is a unique public-private partnership creating a homegrown, competitive workforce with the skills Washington's economy needs.



Two problems

STEM and health care degrees build the economic strength of our state, yet many talented students have not had the support, incentive or guidance to enter and succeed in those fields. This shortage of talent forces employers to look outside Washington to fill some of the best jobs in our state.

1. Young people are not aware of the STEM opportunities available.

Too many young people do not understand the career opportunities available in highdemand fields, miss out on getting an education and then cannot compete for local jobs. In addition, increased tuition makes it difficult for many promising future engineers, scientists and nurses to pursue degrees.

2. Employers need more STEM professionals to fill current jobs.

The state of Washington is a STEM and health care hub, but we currently do not graduate enough qualified people to enter these fields. Employers struggle to find local talent and the need for it will only grow as a generation of skilled employees retires.

Thousands of Boeing engineers will retire in the coming decade.

Estimates show Washington may be short 20,000 registered nurses by 2020.

Microsoft has 3,500+ open computer science and engineering positions.

Get business and government on board

» The Washington State Legislature and businesses, including major employers like Boeing and Microsoft, have joined forces to create a unique public-private partnership.

» The Opportunity Scholarship targets promising low- and middle-income students interested in pursuing STEM and health care degrees who may not qualify for other types of support.

Make it flexible to apply

 The Opportunity Scholarship is renewable and can be used at any public or private college or university in Washington.

In addition to financial support, the Opportunity Scholarship provides mentoring, career advice, internships and access to local leaders in highdemand fields.
