AAI is revitalizing public education

- It created 24 Model of Excellence [MOE] Public Schools that serve more than 23,000 pupils.
- AAI's MOE elementary and high schools have a more-than-95-percent retention and graduation rate, compared to the less-than-50-percent regional average.
- It trained more than 500 teachers and schools administrators.
- Adopt-A-Classroom Links: MOE schools are paired with sister schools in Manila and in the US to solicit educational materials and promote inter-cultural friendship.



Peace Mediation


AAI's Peace programs serve communities affected by inter-cultural and religious conflicts

- In Sulu, AAI's emphasis on grassroots education and livelihood projects has helped persuade guerilla fighters to peacefully integrate into society.
- The AAI Catalysts for Peace project has more than 500 inter-faith college volunteers providing relief in armed conflict zones.
- Trauma Healing Programs have more than 200 community leaders serving more than 10,000 Christian and Muslim families displaced by violence.
