# 120 STUDENTS

On September 7, 2013, we opened the MTM Academy, Liberia's first tuition-free, all-girls school. We provide 120 students a core educational curriculum, a robust after school program, and two hearty meals a day.



## $120\,$ HEALTHY GIRLS

We dewormed 120 girls, treated 38 cases of malaria, and sent 14 students to the hospital for more intensive treatment.



## 1ST SCHOOL COMPUTER LAB

Our Academy is the first school in Monrovia to have a computer lab! We have 30 donated Google Chromebooks and free internet from Novafone.



## $10.4\,$ student teacher ratio

That's akin to an elite private school in the U.S.



## **92%** FEMALE TEACHERS

Ninety-two percent of our teachers are women, showing our students that female leaders not only exist, but are also a necessary part of their country's development.

## HOW THE ACADEMY STACKS UP

### LIBERIAN SCHOOLS

### MTM ACADEMY

#### STUDENT TEACHER RATIO

• 23.8. students per teacher.

• 10.4 students per teacher (akin to an elite private school in the U.S.)

### CLASS SIZE

 In Monrovia, there are 76.5 primary school students per classroom (on average).

• Our largest class has 26 students in it.

#### LIBRARY

- Only 11% of schools have a library.
- Our Busy Bee Library will open in February 2014

### ELECTRICITY

• 6% of primary schools have electricity.

• We've had electricity since Day 1.

### SCHOOL NURSE

- 2.7% of primary schools have a school nurse.
- Not only do we have a school clinic and a school nurse, but we have dewormed 120 students, treated 38 cases of malaria, and referred 14 students to local clinic/hospitals for more intensive care.

### COMPUTER LAB

- 3.1% of schools have a computer lab.
- We received 30 donated Google Chromebooks, donated internet from Novafone, and hired an IT Manager to teach students and staff computer classes.

### FEMALE TEACHERS

• 14.5% of teachers are women.

• At MTM, 92% of our teachers are women, showing our students that female leaders not only exist, but are also a necessary part of their country's development.

### TEACHER TRAINING

- Just over 50% of primary teachers receive some sort of teacher training before entering a classroom.
- 100% of MTM teachers receive training.
