What is RCEF?

The Rural China Education Foundation (RCEF) is an international, 501(c)(3) registered non-profit organization

to promoting dedicated education to enrich children's lives and strengthen communities in rural China. We are made up of professionals and students in China. Europe. America, North and Singapore.



The foundational pillar of RCEF is the strong belief that improving the relevancy and "software" of education providing a motivating learning environment linked to community needs — is crucial to the larger effort to educate and develop rural China.

In the last two decades, government and NGO resources have focused on the basic hardware of education, such as building schools or donating education materials. Thanks to these efforts, access to basic schooling is no longer the critical problem in rural education.

However, the vast majority of rural children still drop out during or immediately after junior middle school, in stark contrast to urban areas where most children finish high school. This is due to a combination of factors, such as lack of relevance schoolwork has to daily life, discouraging teaching methods, financial obstacles and insufficiently trained teachers. The current exam-centered education system is biased towards funneling the best test-takers to urban areas, leaving the vast majority of rural students with few life-relevant skills.



RCEF believes that education should not merely serve as a narrow escape route for the best talents. but develop life

and thinking skills in all children.

How is RCEF different?

- We believe that education should improve the lives of all rural children, not just the ones who do well on tests.
- We focus on what goes on inside the classroom, on the quality of teaching and what students learn.
- We want to help rural children to enjoy learning and develop life skills, self-esteem, and social responsibility through their education.
- We see rural education in the context of rural development. We want to understand and strengthen local communities.

We bring together volunteers from inside and outside of China exchange ideas about education and work to adapt them to the local needs of rural Chinese education.



What does RCEF do?

Volunteer Teaching Program

Every summer. RCEF volunteers run summer camps for rural children. Classes taught include Speaking Skills, Theater Games, Arts & Handcrafts, Philosophy, Health, Oral English, Science Experiments, and Community Research. They are designed to foster creativity, selfstudents' confidence. teamwork. and understanding of the world.

Supporting Volunteerism in China

RCEF identifies college students and grassroots groups in China that have innovative ideas about improving rural education. We subsidize them to do research and



implement quality education projects in villages.

Public Education

RCEF shares teaching materials with other organizations in our annual guidebook. We also have an online Study Group and discussion forum for people to learn more about rural China.

Curriculum Development

RCEF researches and develops effective teaching curriculum for children in rural China. We produce a handbook for short-term volunteers which includes lesson ideas, teaching advice, information on educational psychology and suggestions for planning a short-term volunteer program.
