As many of you know, we've tried & tried again to find a way to help Anna (above right) & Sassoon, our special two who have been in a clinic for too long to count. Many times it has seemed like chasing windmills. However, we made significant progress this month with the help of Erik Logan (above left with staff), a specialist & nurse from Seattle. He spent a week training the staff in how to manage more difficult behaviors. He was able to effectively harness his 19 years of experience in the field & transfer his knowledge to our staff. At the end of his training, with the help of our friend & translator, Anna (above, 2nd from right),

Erik said he was impressed with the staff's work, skills & innate abilities. He said he believed that they now have the training needed to help residents with more acute needs both safely & effectively. He understood their fears & concerns as well, which gave them the ears to hear his words. He ended his training by asking them to think about bringing Anna home soon. And they are thinking about it. A staff meeting will be held tomorrow & we hope to make a decision by the end of April. But we have more reason to hope on behalf of Anna & Sassoon than we have had in a long time. We are especially grateful & hopeful today.
