Since the last progress report in July 2008, our Grass Root Soccer (GRS) team has been busy with the following activities:

- Completing GRS curriculum at the Church Army Academy for youths in grades 4, 5 and 6. Topics covered in these sessions included:
  - Life choices
  - Supporting people with HIV / AIDS etc



Upon completing the GRS curriculum, 102 students at Church Army Academy graduated on Nov 18, and were awarded the participation certificate. For most of these children this is their first ever extra-curricular certificate, which they are very proud to show their families!

In mid-November CASL was visited by Elin Anita Hansen from Norway
