GIZ Representatives visit VAP programs

From 28-30<sup>th</sup> May 2011, two representatives from GIZ youth development football from South Africa, Cora and Marietta both based at the University of Johannesburg, visited VAP as well as Mathare Youth Sports Association (MYSA) a very well respected sport for development organization in Kenya. The purpose of the visit was to conduct an intensive interview and evaluation of VAP programs and its impact on both youth participants and the community at large. The GIZ team conducted interviews with VAP administration staff, Coaches and program participants of different age categories, as well as family members of the participants. The initial outcome of the interviews and evaluation painted a clear picture of the challenges that youth encounter on a daily basis, and the positive impact VAP is having in the community.
