Abigail is a brilliant girl at school who tops her peers in all the subjects. She is very responsible both at home and at school. She is very diligent and her future in education looks promising. However, the financial difficulties faced by her parents do not allow a regular provision of the school materials, including text books. As a result, frequent gaps in class attendance require her to study alone. Despite the evident hardship, she continues to strive for the best result. Abigail's hobbies include reading and listening to music.

Abigail's parents are small traders dealing in the sale of second hand clothing with a low monthly income of \$100, making the regular payment of the school fees extremely difficult. Abigail's parents have three other children to take care of, something that makes the PAAJAF support necessary.

Josephine is 4 years old. She lives with her parents in Gbawe, the Greater Accra Region of Ghana. She is a brilliant girl who loves singing. Her parents, aged 27 and 23, are involved in apprenticeship in fitting and sewing.

Josephine and Kelvin experience difficulties due to their parents' inability to provide them with the school materials, including text books and stationery, and settle their school fees. Since it results in both children frequently studying away from classes, PAAJAF finds it necessary to support the family through its scholarship fund.
