Resources

AMD.org is a comprehensive and accessible source for information, resources, tools and referrals for patients, families and caregivers.

AMD Update is a monthly e-newsletter with important breaking news, articles on research, vision rehabilitation and personal stories about living with AMD.

The AMD Toolkit TM is a large print packet of information and tools especially useful for the person newly diagnosed with AMD and their family members. It describes both dry and wet AMD and includes a magnetic Amsler Grid, a Vision Simulation Card, nutrition guidelines and a list of local resources.

The AMD Warm Line is a toll-free number. Callers connect to a professional and caring staff member who can answer questions about AMD, find local resources, act as an advocate and give emotional support.

Support Groups – A local support group meets in the Los Angeles, California area. Assistance is provided to individuals and groups in other parts of the United States.


Presentations are available for senior groups, medical facilities and health fairs. These include one hour lectures with a question and answer period or longer seminars which include retinologists, low vision specialists and a vision resource fair.

Vision Simulation Card is an easy-to-use tool that shows what it's like to see with macular degeneration, diabetic retinopathy, glaucoma and cataract. The user closes one eye and holds the card directly against the face. Looking through one of the windows gives a personal experience of what it is like to have these eye



diseases. Patients tell us that they like to share the card with family and friends to help them understand the challenges of AMD.

Educational Posters for your office help explain macular degeneration and vision loss to patients and family members. The 30 x 24 inch full color poster shows: a normal Amsler Grid and one as seen by a person with AMD; a normal fundus and one with drusen and exudate; an image of two children as seen with normal sight and as seen by a person with AMD.

Amsler Grids are available in two forms - a magnet with black lines on a white background or an 8x10 peel and stick version with white lines on a black background, including instructions and an image of Betty White showing the testing technique.
