Marcella Gonsalves, 2011 SAGE Scholar

Marcella Gonsalves attended Anna Regina Multilateral School in the Essequibo Coast, Region 2, which is west of Georgetown, Guyana, along the coast of the Atlantic Ocean. Her strong academics and demonstrated financial need made her a strong candidate in the competitive pool of applicants. However, it was the experience she described in her essay that set her apart. Marcella described her work to rebuild a feeding program in her community that was shut down due to inadequate conditions of the old, deteriorating building where it was housed.

When the program was shut down, Marcella and a few other members of her church organized a fundraiser to make repairs on the building so the feeding program could be reopened. Through this experience, Marcella learned about the power of motivation and cooperation. She found it took only a small group of motivated people to get everything started and once it was, many hands pitched in to work towards the same goal for the "good of their community".

Marcella's "goal in life" is to be "of service to humanity". The experience rebuilding the feeding program was one step in her journey. She is now working towards a degree in Medical Technology with which she plans to work in various hospitals in Guyana, especially those in the more remote areas.

The academic achievements and leadership abilities of Kaveta Mohammed from Guyana's capital, Georgetown, illustrated her great potential and earned her a SAGE Scholarship. Kaveta chose to pursue a degree in International Relations because she has noticed how globalization has affected Guyana. Through her experiences, Kaveta realized that Guyana is "no longer that little country hidden away in South America," and that the country's "potential is being recognized by [Guyana's] continental neighbors." As such, Kaveta desires to become a translator to help build Guyana's relations with the World.




"Every child must be given equal access to education resources..."
