

SHI Strategies for Success



- Working only with people who have requested technical assistance to adopt sustainable land-use practices
- Encouraging participants to decide which new methods will work best for them, instead of using a cookie-cutter approach
- Partnering with local institutions and hiring local experts to work with program participants
- Providing regular, long-term assistance until participants are comfortable using the new techniques on their own

Planting Hope

SHI's program has taught Pedro Bolon, a Mayan farmer in southern Belize, organic gardening techniques and provided his family with the seeds to get started.



"We received different varieties of seeds to plant. We were also provided with technical visits and training on a weekly basis. I give the vegetables to my wife to cook in order for my children to achieve proper and healthier nutrition,

for sturdy growth, to study better and (have) a healthy lifestyle." - Pedro Bolon

Each acre farmed sustainably represents six acres of forest saved from slashand-burn agriculture, a leading cause of tropical deforestation.

Restoring Forests

Working with SHI, the Hernandez brothers in Panama have planted many tree species started as seedlings in their nursery. "The environment has improved, and in our agricultural plots, the production has increased. We have


less erosion in our lands," says Bernardo Hernandez.

Tree planting has also improved the water situation on the farm. "When we started, there was a spring but the flow of water was small. How the water has increased, since we have protected it by planting diverse trees!" Planting shadeloving crops like coffee, cocoa and ginger under spice, fruit and hardwood trees protects hillsides

and watersheds from erosion and runoff, while providing habitat for wildlife and products for farmers to sell. SHI participants have planted more than 2,000,000 trees!

Nourishing Communities

In his third year of work with SHI, Don Cheyo used sustainable practices to cultivate Tabasco peppers, watermelon and passion fruit on 2.25 acres of land in Honduras. When the crops sold for a net profit of US \$4,000, Don Cheyo's income rose 800% above the average income in his community!


