


WHO WE ARE

Project Education Sudan (PES) is a US 501(c)(3) charitable organization, and a registered NGO with the government of South Sudan. In 2005, PES was formed as a partnership of Sudanese and Americans to help South Sudan create the educational opportunities it so desperately needs. Our mission is to help fund and assist indigenous Sudanese organizations and communities that create educational infrastructure in rural South Sudan. We support the building of primary and secondary schools and emphasize the inclusion of girls and women in the educational opportunities we promote.



THE NEED WE FILL


Decades of brutal civil war in Sudan between the dominant Islamic north, and the Christian and animist people in the south followed Sudan's independence in 1956. This war demolished most of the villages of the south; destroyed what minimal infrastructure that existed; and resulted in 2.2 million deaths and the displacement of over 4 million southern civilians. In 2005, the Comprehensive Peace Agreement was signed between the North and South granting southern Sudan a six-year period of autonomy prior to referendum election. The Republic of South Sudan was established on July 9th, 2011, with 99% voting to secede from the North. The education of children and adults is crucial to the sustained prosperity and self-sufficiency in The Republic of South Sudan.



HOW WE WORK

PES works with local community leaders and partners with other international and indigenous organizations in South Sudan to help build, staff, and supply primary and secondary schools. To create a self-sustaining model, PES promotes community involvement and local economic development through school construction, pilot program development, feminine hygiene sanitary programs, income literacy, teacher training and leadership development. We are committed to bringing clean water, commercial grinding mills, cinderblock and sewing machines to the communities in which we work.

We follow the UNICEF accountability model in funding of projects, project inspection and verification of spending requests, working closely with the Sudanese organizations and communities we assist to ensure transparency. Our US Executive Director, Sudan Program Director, and a team of dedicated staff and volunteers perform the activities of PES.



OUR PROJECTS

Currently, PES works cooperatively with rural communities to support the building of four schools, serving over 3,000 students in three villages in Bor and Twic East Counties, Jonglei State.

- Jonglei Hope Secondary Academy, Maar
- Marc Nikkel Primary School, Maar
- Ayak Anguei Girls' Primary Boarding School, Konbek,
- Tong Pagook Primary School, Pagook

We plan to assist these schools until they become self-sufficient. A full time Sudan Program Director and part time Field Coordinator in South Sudan oversee all four school sites.

Regular trips to South Sudan by staff and US funding sources are taken to build relationships, meet with village leaders, field staff, and assess and monitor development.

We are building long-term commitments from corporations, foundations, schools, individuals and religious organizations in the U.S. to help us fund our activities in South Sudan. Our Sister School Program encourages cross-cultural understanding between American and Sudanese students. We are partners with The Josef Korbel School of International Studies, African Initiatives, and The Women's College at The University of Denver, The College of Education at Oklahoma State University, Ears To Our World, and schools and universities across the nation.
