A Personal Journey with Prajwala

Prawjala believes that the movement against sex trafficking will become truly sustainable and transformative when insights and best practices are shared among professionals in the sector. Sujatha Kalagadda (MSW), Prajwala's Shelter Director, shares her experience working with victims and survivors of trafficking since 2005.

"Dealing with the children, in my opinion, is like dealing with the God. My first job was in Prajwala's children's home as a residential



counselor. I was there to make them feel happy, but actually it was the children who filled my life with joy. I was so thrilled have the to opportunity to work with the children who

needed help most—trafficked, abused and HIV infected all under one roof. In spite of their troubles they received me with full heart and innocent smiles every day. My responsibility first and foremost was to counsel them and look after their medical and physical needs, as well as motivate them for rehabilitation through education. The children were free to share their feelings with me confidently, ranging from sadness and pain to reasons for celebration. Sometimes HIV+ children severally suffered with TB and sexual transmitted diseases at ages as young as 5-7 years. Their health condition was monitored daily to ensure steps were taken for quick recovery.

The way that Dr. Sunitha Krishnan, co-founder of Prajwala, showed such love and affection towards the children, made a huge impact on me. She not only remembered the names of hundreds of children, but also treated each like her own daughter. Slowly I unconsciously adopted this caring and supportive behavior, and a strong sense of unity developed among the children, who showed a high level of discipline and responsibility. A partner system was created in which older children mentored and looked after the younger ones, so it became like one big family. For 4 years I was an elder sister to them. Then, in 2009 I got a chance to work with adult victims of trafficking,

which was an entirely different experience. Although I was initially overwhelmed, Dr. Krishnan gave me so much courage and strength that I eventually learned how to manage the entire shelter. Every day,

while taking case studies the of rescued women, I developed a nonjudgmental attitude and strove to not get overly emotionally involved. It took me some time to learn to balance how trusting relationships with



shelter with multiple disorders, syndromes, infections and addictions, often passed away due to AIDS or cancer. Whenever a victim died, my heart would break, and it was unbearable to see such suffering before they left the world. The realization that the dangerous conditions of the flesh trade was

the reason why so many women lost their valuable lives, made me provide service to them with all my heart and energy. Even in the most difficult circumstances, such as victim deaths or when they escaped the shelter, the words "I CAN NOT" never entered my thoughts. I always found a way, in the deepest crises, to ask God for courage and strength to deal and cope with these situations. Dr. Krishnan used to tell us, "if you want to do something, and you have a pure-hearted intention, please go ahead." With this in mind, I started lead the entire shelter home with hundreds of residents and built a committed team with enormous confidence. Despite these achievements, instilling hope in the lives of women and

children whose minds, bodies and spirits have been shattered, is not always easy. Every individual has to put their energy to make this happen and help the victims see the opportunity to change their lives for the better. Like water in the ocean, every drop counts, and when we all put our hands together to save their lives, it can be accomplished. Because of Dr. Krishnan's leadership, and the cooperation of my team, I have been able to manage an entire intervention in the face of daunting challenges. Failures have been my greatest teachers, as well as my stepping stones to success."

> The Community-Based Prevention Program conducted 32 human trafficking sensitization programs successfully, in which Members participated and 3981 signatures taken petitioning against the demand for prostitution.

Prajwala inaugurated one new transition center in Singareni Colony, which is currently serving over 35 at-risk children living in communities with high prevalence of child marriage, prostitution, trafficking, and other crimes.
