

Even though the digital gender gap is a global issue, the situation in Ghana is even worse



- Since 2019, Grow Ghana brings vital IT skills into the heart of the rural schools in Ghana, using Raspberry Pi devices and playful coding projects – currently empowering >100 learners weekly
- In Ghana 1.6 million girls (38%) at the age 6 17 do not use any ICT devices on a regular basis¹
- The reason is not just a lack of access to ICT devices but culture norms, societal expectations and gender stereotypes
- It is not common that females follow their own vision and passion because they are often pushed into roles that are expected of them (e.g. housewife, mother)
- Our observation during our trainings is that girls tend to be hesitant when using ICT devices and often defer to their male classmates – they required dedicated empowerment

Grow Ghana plans to implement the "Female ICT Booster Program" for true gender inclusion



- Grow Ghana already has a solid foundation to empower specifically girls in ICT – the majority (70%) of our students are females
- Our new "Female ICT Booster Program" follows the mission to empower our female students in a supportive and protective environment.
 - Tailored female coding classes with female-only instructors on a weekly basis
 (for 20 girls per week in the ages of 14 to 18)
 - Workshops and information events
 "Females in ICT" on a regular basis in our partner schools (monthly)
 - Collaboration with female role models in society and in the field of ICT (guest speaker in sessions)

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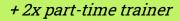
