### Grantee Partners: Creating Opportunities



Last year, The Women's Foundation invested in Year Up to support young women entering its job training program.

"I used to balance \$50 a month for child support just for cell phone and diapers," says Kimberly Holloway, a single mother of two young children. "[Making ends meet] was very hard and it gave me the initiative not to be ending up a negative statistic."

Kimberly's determination took her to Year Up, a Women's Foundation Grantee Partner that prepares young adults to begin IT careers. After months of classroom training, participants transition into internships at companies and organizations across the National Capital region. For many, those internships turn into permanent jobs.

"Year Up actually helps to change the mentality of the young people we're working with by helping them to start thinking about what a career looks like," says Executive Director Ronda Harris Thompson.

Kimberly's experience at Year Up led to a position as an Associate Intelligence Analyst at Cyveillance, stability for her and her two children, and new career aspirations.

"It really opened up a lot of opportunities for me financial-wise and professionally," she says, adding that her future goals include applying for a position with the CIA.
