Trap-Neuter-Return improves the lives of feral cats, improves their relationships with the humans who live near them, and decreases the size of colonies over time.

Studies document that after neutering, cats become healthier and gain weight, and that the lifespan of cats in managed colonies increases.

In addition, studies have found that aggressive interactions among cats in managed colonies decrease after spaying or neutering, while affectionate interactions increase.

Cats in neutered colonies also roam less and do not fight over mates.



Animal control's catch and kill method is cruel and doesn't work! It costs approximately \$100 to capture, board and eventually kill a homeless animal, which costs more than a spay or neuter!

Feral Cats do not contract disease at any higher rate than owned cats and do NOT deplete wildlife-HUMANS do by destroying habitats and pollution.

Feeding bans don't stop cats from "multiplying" either; only neutering does! **Therefore, if you feed stray cats, you must take it the next step and participate in Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR).**

Caring for a feral cat colony has tremendous benefits to caregivers, neighbors, and the cats. Though cats have been living outdoors for over 10,000 years on their own, there are steps that YOU can take to promote their well-being, make them good neighbors, and assist the people who live nearby in understanding the cats.
