Our Mission: The Ama Foundation is dedicated to providing the most underprivileged children of Nepal with a loving home, education and the opportunity to live healthy and secure lives within their community.

Ama Ghar was the vision of Founder Shrawan Nepali, who spent part of his childhood at Paropokar orphanage in Kathmandu. With the support of his godmother, Ama Tika Basnet, and Peace Corps



volunteers who befriended him, Shrawan went to the US to complete college and establish a successful career.

But he never forgot those less fortunate he had left behind in Nepal, so he founded Ama Ghar, with the help of Ama Tika and Shekhar Silwal, in 2001 — the first 14 children arrived at Ama Ghar during that year.



Bonnie Ellison joined Ama Ghar as Managing Director and Country Director for Ama Foundation in 2002. Known as "Bonnie Auntie" to

the children, she has a deep committment to the culture because she grew up in Nepal - arriving in Nepal in 1956 with her USAID family.

At Ama Ghar, the children are raised as an extended Nepali family, considering each other to be brothers and sisters; in addition, they are part of the village community. They study Nepali language and traditions, including Nepali dance, music and art. Even after the children graduate and are able to support themselves, they are always welcome to come back to their Ama Ghar home to celebrate holidays or visit their brothers and sisters, aunties and uncles.

Higher Education Fund

At Ama Ghar, we have a group of over 20 teenagers who are eligible for higher education which puts a severe strain on our budget. In Nepal, "higher education" starts after Grade 10. If the children pass a national examination after Grade 10, they are qualified to continue their education.

Our goal is for each of the children to be educated as far as their individual talents can take them. For some children, this means vocational education so that they can learn a trade; for others, it means college or university. Currently, we have children studying computer science, animation, architecture, hotel management, business and health care and some of our older children have already graduated medical school and nursing school.
