Who is the Feral Cat Coalition of Oregon?

The Feral Cat Coalition of Oregon (FCCO) provides donation-based spay/neuter clinics for feral (untamed) and

stray cats. Caregivers feeding these cats trap them, bring them to one of our clinics, and after surgery, return the cats to where they are being fed. Trap-neuter-return (TNR) programs like ours are effective at humanely reducing feral cat populations. Without our services cats would continue to breed, causing needless suffering for future litters.



Since our inception in 1995, FCCO has spayed/neutered, and vaccinated, nearly 50,000 cats.

In just the past year alone FCCO spayed/neutered 5,500 cats utilizing volunteers, including volunteer veterinarians. If left unaltered, these cats could have produced an additional 22,000 kittens in a year–born on our streets and destined to live difficult lives. No other organization provides similar services for feral and stray cats, and relief for the caregivers who feed them, who are often low-income and need our support.
