

What You Can Do To Make A Difference

- 1. Visit www.nyakaschool.org or thepriceofstones.com for more information, book reviews, our event calendar, and ideas.
- 2. Become a friend of the Nyaka AIDS Foundation on Facebook—or become Jackson Kaguri's friend there. You can also follow Jackson on Twitter at twitter.com/twejaka.
- 3. Recommend The Price of Stones to a friend; colleague; book club; women's group; your church, synagogue, or mosque; civic group; Rotary, Elks, or other club; or any group interested in education, literacy, cross-cultural issues, Uganda, HIV/AIDS prevention, or alleviating poverty. Help spread the word-of-mouth by offering to lead a discussion of the book at your house of worship, library, or book club.
- 4. Check to see if The Price of Stones is in your local library. If not, either donate a copy or suggest to your librarian that the book be added to the collection. Ask your friends or family in other states to do this also. Or check to see if the book is in the library of your church, synagogue, or mosque; if not, donate a copy or recommend the book to your librarian.
- 5. Encourage your local independent or chain bookstore to carry this book if you don't see it on the shelves.
- 6. Write a book review about The Price of Stones for Amazon.com, Barnes & Noble, Borders, or a blog. Your comments will help bring awareness to this (or any) book. Share your blog with us so we can share it with others.
