The format of the report was revised during the meeting and each leader will be required to submit this report in order to receive their pay check each month.

The new natural (irregular) design is more time consuming to produce, but results in a beautiful product. Instead of cutting each cocoon into a square, the cocoons retain their natural shape and each woman sews around the cocoons. The SEPALI staff are very satisfied with the progress of the women's groups in learning this complicated new technique.

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SEPALI meeting- July 7th

From the 9<sup>th</sup> to the 13<sup>th</sup>, SEPALI hosted another textile workshop with the Anjarasoa women's group from Ambodivoangy. The 5 women stayed in Maroantsetra for 5 days to produce the textile and learned quickly. After only one day of training, the women were already getting the hang of it and producing a high quality product. Over the course of 5 days, the women were able to produce over 6 meters of textile.

#### Report from the field

All SEPALI team members brought good news home this month. On each mission, the team spread awareness to new communities about the SEPALI program, found new members, developed solutions for reoccurring problems, and gave assistance to farmers interested in starting the rearing process.

The recent field mission to Ambatofotsy, Ambohisoa, Marovovonana, and Ambodimangatelo took place over the course of 5 days. After meeting with all of the existing communities, the team met with the new group in Ambatofotsy and acquired 6 new members. In Ambohisoa, the team discussed the issues with the rearing. Many farmers with mature trees are reluctant to start rearing larvae without further training and support. The team set up a time to offer that extra training on a future date.

In Marovovonana, which also requested further training, SEPALI staff offered a training session and provided more equipment to farmers who are already rearing larvae. Ambodimangatelo farmers will work on transplanting their mature tree nurseries to their land over the coming months. Rastafanoel, the current leader, requested an official election to determine the president and officers of the group.

Training in Marovovonana

Our second mission of the month was to Mahalevona from the 23<sup>rd</sup> to the 26<sup>th</sup>. Here, we found a very enthusiastic new group that continues to grow by the day. All of the group members who received plastic planting pots last month finished filling their pots with soil and were ready and waiting for seedlings. SEPALI had to bring seedlings in two sets because the new members had already run out of seedlings by the afternoon of the first day. One farmer from the village volunteered to travel back to the SEPALI office (a three hour trip) and bring the next round of seedlings.

By the end of the mission, all members who had previously received pots had finished planting all of their seedlings and build their tree nurseries. In addition to the first group members, SEPALI attracted 17 new members and received invitations from 2 surrounding communities to start farmer groups in those towns. During the next mission, the SEPALI team will need to bring at least 4,750 seedlings to satisfy the town's needs.
