

PATHFINDER INTERNATIONAL IN ETHIOPIA

The average Ethiopian woman bears 5.9 children during her reproductive years. Consequently, population growth rates are high. The imbalance between population growth and agricultural productivity has placed Ethiopia in perpetual crisis for food security and social welfare.

Pathfinder began supporting reproductive health efforts in Ethiopia in 1964 through a small grant to establish a local organization, now called FGAE. Pathfinder committed to a major effort in Ethiopia by opening an office in 1995 and helping to launch major community-based reproductive health (CBRH) services in the country. Today, that effort encompasses nearly 50 partnerships with local organizations providing quality reproductive health, family planning and – more recently – HIV/AIDS care and support services to rural communities with little access to health care.

more than 7,000 Pathfinder-trained Community-Based Reproductive Health (CBRH) Agents are bringing counseling, family planning methods, and referrals directly into poor and hard-to-reach communities. Particular focus on postabortion care offers quality medical services to women who have resorted to illegal and unsafe abortions. CBRH Agents also refer rural women to professional care services for safe pregnancy, births and childcare. These efforts have saved the lives of thousands of women and children in the few short years that the program has been in operation.

TRANSFORMING WOMEN'S LIVES

No program can address the health needs of women in Ethiopia without addressing the harmful traditional practices that continue to endanger women's lives and cause widespread suffering. Deeply imbedded in tradition,

religious beliefs, and custom, these practices include Female Genital Cutting (FGC), early marriage, marriage by abduction, and gender based violence. Pathfinder joins with many committed organizations, religious leaders, and other professionals to enhance gender sensitivity and eradicate these practices. Though progress is slow, it does evolve with the professional involvement of local leaders who are sensitive to the beliefs and feelings of the community. Those villages where men and women have united to renounce FGC as a community are inspiring examples of the possibility of change.


COMBATING HIV/AIDS

With the emergence of the global HIV/AIDS pandemic, Pathfinder pioneered in integrating reproductive health services with HIV/AIDS prevention, care and support, drawing on the unique relationships already in place between

trained providers and their clients dealing with sexuality and health. Today, thousands of women who might never have access to HIV/AIDS information and care are receiving these services, and people living with the illness are receiving the family planning advice they need. Pathfinder has gone farther, developing special programs to reach high-risk groups, including commercial sex workers and middle distance bus drivers, as well as hundreds of children orphaned by the AIDS pandemic.

Basic training and refresher training of CBRH Agents is ongoing. Supervisors and health facility service providers learn to enhance the quality of care delivered and to involve clients in the identification and evaluation of the services offered.
