


WHAT WE DO



MYF IMPACT CASE STUDY

onor (name/gender changed to respect privacy) was born in 1997 into a broken home environment in inner-city Dublin where domestic violence was a regular occurrence. Witnessing regular violent behaviour was perceived as *normal* for Conor. With little or no support structure due to his difficult family circumstances Conor quickly became isolated with no goals or ambitions and poor communication skills.

The impact of Conor's turbulent home environment could also be seen at school where his learned behaviour caused problems for him not just from an academic perspective but also in how he interacted with his peers. Conor's grades were poor, further compounding his low self-esteem.

It is often the case that young people who witness aggressive behaviour in the home become unwitting targets for bullies at school – this was the case for Conor who was regularly picked on by others.

Conor had no positive male role models in his life and was often in trouble for using bad language and displaying aggressive, disrespectful and sexist behaviour.

Try to imagine Conor's life story if his circumstances had remained unchallenged. Scary isn't it?

MUSIC CHANGES LIVES....

since joining our music education programme Conor's life has changed completely. No longer introverted with poor social skills and no creative outlet Conor has truly flourished by being part of our guitar group. He no longer feels isolated, has grown socially, creatively and academically.

No longer the target of bullies, Conor's peers have also witnessed the change in him as his confidence, relationships and grades have improved respectively. With this new found confidence Conor has joined a band and even has a girlfriend - things that would have been impossible for him previously as he struggled with communication and relationship management due to the behaviour witnessed and learnt at home.

Before joining our programme Conor was a boy with no real drive or ambition who would retreat within himself he is now a confident young man with a previously undiscovered natural flair for music. Conor is now determined to finish school and go on to further education where his ambition is to study music so that he can become a music teacher and help others as he has been helped.

The students involved in the guitar groups have developed better social skills and are more able to communicate their feelings. There are some in these groups who would have difficult enough life situations and for them I believe these classes are a little haven. The students have a great sense of achievement and 'try' without fearing failure. This has been a huge step for some. For children for whom there is a high risk of leaving school early, we have found the guitar lessons of particular benefit in keeping and re-engaging them in the education process – **Aoife Kelly, Vice-Principal**
