

## Achievements and Impact

- CHoiCe is a 4 Star Member Hospice of the Hospice Palliative Care Association (HPCA) of South Africa. This was achieved due to the high quality of policy and procedural implementation by CHoiCe and its standard of palliative care services
- The organisation reached 1,029 children in 2011/2012 with 4,099 services provided by its trained OVC staff
- CHoiCe works with 27 farms to improve the health outcomes for more than 2,000 farm workers
- Through its 65 caregivers, CHoiCe carries out home-based care as one of the Service Providers for the Department of Health, Mopani District
- 2,109 persons were trained by CHoiCe Trust during 2011
- 74% of learners who took part in an accredited CHoiCe training during 2011 passed with more than 50% in their final assessment
- CHoiCe developed an innovative training manual for training community members and Community Care Workers on Water, Sanitation and Hygiene principles
- The organization contributed to the development and finalization of various strategic documents, including a Gender Framework for NGOs based on the gender mainstreaming process completed by CHoiCe
- CHoiCe has supported the process for the establishment of local forums such as the Limpopo Fundraising Forum and the Ntirhisano Health Forum

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## An Introduction

Established in 1997, CHoiCe has responded to the need for health care interventions in Mopani District, Limpopo Province for many years. CHoiCe works with key population groups, including patients, children, farm workers and community members from rural villages, in order to improve access to the health care system and strengthen grassroots responses to health care issues. The activities of the organisation correspond with the national plans and strategies, and specifically align with the South African HIV and AIDS, STI and TB National Strategic Plan.

CHoiCe works with qualified staff members in order to achieve its mission and the organisation endeavours to improve coordination of service delivery, facilitate networking activities to avoid duplication, and strengthen role-player relationships for enhanced referral systems. Through shifting donor priorities and government responses, CHoiCe will continue to do everything possible to ensure that the most vulnerable people in Mopani District access their essential services.

## The CHoiCe Trust Intervention Model and Services



CHoiCe Trust commits itself to working towards well-being ownership, capacity building, stakeholder engagement and advocacy to ensure that vulnerable persons are able to access essential services in realisation of their basic rights.

Key beneficiary groups include the following:

- Children
- Patients
- Farm Workers
- Community Members
- Caregivers (Community Care Workers)

A core aspect of the model is the enhancement of support structures within the community to ensure that community members have a platform to access their services. This includes stakeholder consultation and partnerships with municipalities, government departments and grassroots organisations.

CHoiCe Trust will directly implement for immediate health service delivery where the need for such is identified by the community, and will also work with key stakeholders to ensure services are accessed by the communities and by the most vulnerable beneficiary groups.

Direct services include the following:

- HIV Counselling and Testing and referrals to clinics
- Tuberculosis screenings and referrals to clinics
- Health talks and awareness campaigns such as

Immunisations; Stigma and Discrimination; and Teenage Pregnancy

- Accredited Health trainings such as HIV and AIDS; STIs; and Tuberculosis
- Non-accredited trainings such as Food Security; Water, Sanitation and Hygiene; and Journey of Life
- Support to children through Forums and interventions in schools and homes for the protection of rights
- Support on farms and farm workers
- Training and mentoring of community care workers
