

# UEI TEACH REPORT MARCH — JUNE 2013

## U&I TEACH

With twenty nine classes a week, in eight education based Learning Centers catering to over 450 students across the city, U&I helps increase the employability of women, children and youth from lesser privileged backgrounds. Short and long term courses in the following subjects are offered:

- 1) Soft Skills
- 2) English
- 3) Tuitions
- 4) Conversational English



The academic year 2012-13 draws to a close in March 2013 and the summer camp, "Dazzle" rolls onto the carpet to dazzle both the children and the summer interns alike. In our previous academic year, we taught at 8 learning centres with a total of 380 students and 220 volunteers. At the end of the year both the students and the volunteers were assessed and evaluated. The 8 learning centres were:

## OASIS

This project is mainly a tuitions

project which functioned from Monday to Friday with the total number a students being 30. The student attendance was recorded to be 72% and the volunteer attendance was recorded to be 82%. The total number of classes conducted for the betterment of the children was 168. One of the major issues faced at this project was the low volunteer attendance. But, despite that, we achieved pass percentage of 98% and 6 out of 7 children facing their SSLC board exams, passed.

(BALAKIYA BALA MANDIRA)

Considering the floating population at this specific project, the course taught was life skills on Thursdays and Saturdays with the average number of students being

The number of classes conducted was 42 and the stdent attendance was 85%. With the volunteer attendance being 75%, the students were trained in bag making, candle making and arts and crafts to help them be as independent as possible and to encourage budding entrepreneurs.

#### KARUNALAYA

Running on Saturdays and

Sundays, this project aimed at teaching English. A total of 96 classes were conducted with 100% student attendance amongst the 22 students. With a volunteer attendance of 93%, 98% passed in the primary level, 84% in the beginner and 81% at the Basic level. One of the major issues faced at this project was the communication barrier but still, targets were met sufficiently.

#### WOMEN'S HOME (STATE CRISIS INTERVENTION CENTRE)

With a floating population of women, the main courses taught

were spoken English and life skills on Fridays and Saturdays. The total number of classes conducted was 67 with the number of students being 40. Student attendance was 65% with the volunteer attendance being 83%. The women learnt vocational skills and arts like bag making and candle making.

#### SHISHU MANDIR VOCATIONAL COLLEGE

Conducted on Saturdays, this project aimed at teaching English. The total number of students was 56. The student attendance was 79% and he volunteer attendance was 87%. Although the students were low in confidence, they were taught spoken English and series of mock interviews were conducted to boost their confidence.

#### **SNEHADEEP**

A total number of 12 students

were taught on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. This was a tuitions project wherein the total number of classes conducted was 77 with the student and volunteer attendance being 90% and 71% respectively. The major issue faced in this project was communication barriers between the students and the teachers despite which, 6 out of 8 students facing their PUC board exams, passed.

The centre had a lack of space, which was one of the major issues faced there. A pass percentage of 90% was achieved among the students at doddigunta

At the same centre, spoken English was taught from Monday to Thursday to a total of 12 students in 56 classes. The student and volunteer attendance was 97% and 86% respectively and various tests and mock interviews were conducted to help the students find better jobs.



- 8) GOVERNMENT HOME FOR BOYS



# GOVERNMENT BOYS HOME FOR THE MENTALLY CHALLENGED




Housing a total of 85 mentally challenged boys, this centre is by far the most touching. At our summer camps, a trip to the cubbon park was organized. The home was thoroughly cleaned, including the toilets to improve the state of hygiene. Arts, crafts, music, dance were all conducted for these boys which was thoroughly joyous for both the volunteers and the inmates of the home. The various clothes of the boys were cleaned and sorted for better use.





#### MUSLIM ORPHANAGE FOR BOYS



Containing various introvert children, music and games were conducted to break the ice. The children also participated in various personality development activities to strengthen their characters positively. Apart from this, Arts and crafts such as mask making and games such as rag toss, dog and the bone and cup relay were also conducted.





## MUSLIM ORPHANAGE FOR GIRLS



The girls were introduced to public speaking, themed "Dreams" to improve their vocational skills and various arts and crafts such as bird masks were also introduced. Human caterpillar and relay were some of the games that were played along with the children.





# SHISHU MANDIR COLLEGE



Our aim was to mainly prepare these children for interviews and hence confidence building activities and mock interviews were conducted.

Apart from this Handbook making was taught and games such as obstacle race and human pipe were played.





# SHISHU MANDIR SCHOOL



Analyzing the students dreams and aspirations took on a major role here. Career counseling was done based on the results of the analysis. Apart from this, various teamwork building activities were conducted and the highlight of the camp would be the talent show for the students.





#### WOMENS HOME




At the women's home, the main activity was to encourage career building and to highlight the importance of a good career. Arts and crafts such as, basket making, and music and games to engage the women and lift up their spirits were also conducted at the camp.





#### KARUNALAYA



A two-day camp with personality development was a priority at this centre. The students came forwards with innovative "Mad-ads" and skits which helped build their confidence. A trip to the cubbon park was organized and a class about space science was conducted by the planetarium faculty.





#### HOME OF HOPE (CHENNAI)



An assessment of the students' proficiency in English was done and was further improved upon. For the benefit of the children, various exercises on grooming and personal hygiene were conducted along with confidence building activities. A trip to the beach along with the U&I Volunteer's and staff was also organized which both the children and the volunteer thoroughly enjoyed.







With the summer camps being a grand success and a much needed eye opener for various volunteers, many a mentors and role models were witnessed and hopefully, many more will be in the near future. Our aim for the next academic year is to reach over 300 students with 500 recruited volunteers, setting up new learning centers at the muslim orphanage and to educate over 650 children between the age of 8 and 20 and women of

18-40.

Our vision is to upgrade to version 2.0 with better systems, up to date tracking, an aim to go deeper and not wider, weekly reporting, periodic assessments, faster problem solving and providing a much needed better quality of education to each child.
