



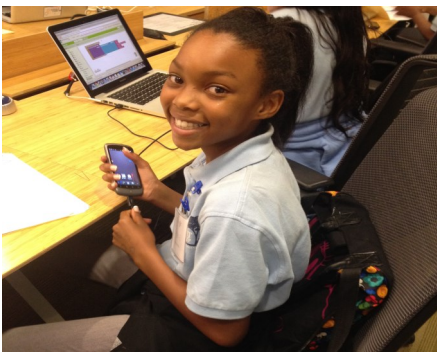
CITIZEN SCHOOLS HELPS STUDENTS AND SCHOOLS TRANSFORM...
