MOTHERS IN UGANDA ARE DYING

In Uganda, 16 women die during pregnancy and birth every single day – 90% of these cases are preventable.

A recent UNFPA report showed that when educated to international standards, midwives can provide 90% of the essential care to women and newborns and potentially reduce maternal and newborn deaths by two thirds.

Sadly, only 58% of births in Uganda are attended by skilled health personnel. It is estimated that Uganda needs 1400 more trained midwives to provide universal maternity care coverage.

However, simply having a midwife is not enough. In order to improve infant & maternal health, midwives need quality education with extensive hands on training.



OUR SOLUTION

At Shanti Uganda, we've created a model to eradicate preventable maternal mortality that can be replicated throughout Uganda, East Africa and the world.

Since opening our Birth House in 2010, we have never lost a mother.

Shanti Uganda improves maternal & infant health throughout East Africa. We imagine a world where all women have access to a midwife and are respected, empowered and able to thrive throughout the birth process.

We accomplish this through our unique off-the-grid Birth House.

PLANS TO SCALE

Our plans for 2017 include expanding our **Community Garden Program**, offering more **Teen Girls Health & Education Workshops** and launching a unique program specifically for **Teen Boys**. We will also begin a multi-year strategy to expand our outreach services reaching more women in the community through our innovative use of **Traditional Birth Attendants**.

Our vision is to elevate the level of training now available to students in Uganda by offering a **Certificate of Midwifery**, endorsed by the Ministry of Education. In partnership with the Canadian Association of Midwives and the Ugandan Ministry of Health, The **Shanti Uganda Midwifery Training School** will target women throughout East Africa who are passionate about maternal health and the midwifery model of care. The school will be a leader in midwifery education throughout Uganda teaching modern midwives using Shanti Uganda's unique model of collaborative, holistic care. Tuition will both fund the school and existing Birth House and have the added benefit of expanding our model of care throughout East Africa by way of training future midwives.

Budget & Financials

Our revenue model is both sustainable and engaging. Raising a significant portion of our revenue from our International Doula-Training and Prenatal Yoga Teacher Training and competitive Internship Program, we are continuously working to reduce our reliance on outside funding. Additional funding comes from individual and corporate donations, events and grants.

With a current operating budget of \$250,000, Shanti Uganda has a big on-the-ground impact and administrative spending is routinely kept below 10%. **In 2015, charitable programs accounted for 86%, fundraising 11% and administrative costs 3% of all expenses.** With financial support, Shanti Uganda will continue to expand our model of care throughout East Africa.
