Project Workplan for 2013-2014

This workplan describes the commitment to project work between GlobeMed at Rutgers and CSSD for September 2013 - July 2014. This workplan may but does not necessarily include the workplan for on-site visits to CSSD by GlobeMed at Rutgers, nor does it include any smaller or less intensive projects that may come up throughout the year (such as research ideas).

I. Project Description- "HIV/AIDS Prevention and Health Education Program Among Women Entertainment Workers"

A. Description of the project:

Objective 1:

- Create targeted behavioral changes among Entertainment Workers that emphasize risk reduction and promote safer sexual practices.
 - The outreach workers will work with GlobeMed at Rutgers to create culturally sensitive and scientifically accurate sexual health education modules. Outreach workers will incorporate these modules, which will cover health education about unexpected pregnancies, abortions and hygienic practices, into the group discussion sessions with EWs.
- Entertainment Workers will attend group meetings led by CSSD peer facilitators and staff outreach workers where they will discuss HIV/AIDS, STDs, and general sexual health related education. The discussions will support and foster the development of sexual health risk management through practical health education facts and guidelines.

Objective 2:

- Build a supportive environment for EW sexual health by mobilizing stakeholders such as entertainment establishment owners, healthcare providers and others
- Entertainment Worker's stakeholders will meet quarterly to discuss the realities of the issues EWs are currently facing, including their causes and consequences, and how to get EWs equal opportunity to access health care services.

Objective 3:

Promote and increase access to health information, products and services for EW's.
CSSD will work to decrease stigma and discrimination focused towards Entertainment
Workers so that health care providers will be willing to provide them health care services and education.

B. Intended Project Impact:

- Decrease stigma and discrimination surrounding women entertainment workers in the capital city, Phnom Penh.
- Provide the means for a supportive community where entertainment workers can discuss the issues they face, learn about safe sexual health and hygiene practices, and reduce

- their risk for getting HIV/AIDS and other sexual health related conditions (STIs and general sexual hygiene issues)
- Mobilize those in the communities, such as entertainment establishment owners and health care providers, to come together to discuss how to get entertainment workers access to health care services

C. Measurement of Project Impact

Output	750 of entertainment workers reached; 240 of EW referred to appropriate health services; 120 group discussion sessions conducted and 2 semesters meeting conducted with relevant stakeholders.

- Spread awareness of the project and CSSD's mission on campus through campaigns.
- Keep CSSD updated on progress of fundraising and impact of campaigns on campus.
