FAME is a pre-college enrichment program that prepares and motivates traditionally underrepresented minority students and girls in grades 7-12 to enter college and complete a baccalaureate degree in engineering, science, math or technology related fields of study.

The program consists of a 4-6 week summer enrichment program, a school year extension and enrichment program on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month, college preparation seminars, test awareness programs and other special events and activities.

Since its inception, FAME has served as a direct link for students to industry leaders. Our students enjoy such benefits as internships, scholarships, and rare opportunities to interact with top executives, engineers, scientist, and technology specialist working for Fortune 500 organizations. Many of the aforementioned professionals are FAME Alum.



FORUM TO ADVANCE MINORITIES IN ENGINEERING

Objectives:

- Establish local action activities in support of the goal of the National Action Council on Minorities in Engineering (NACME). That goal is to increase the number of Blacks, Hispanics, Native Americans and other underrepresented minorities on an educational path leading to a baccalaureate degree in engineering.
- Motivate students to pursue and succeed in science and math required for acceptance into colleges of engineering.
- Expose students to cultural, academic, and industrial environments.
- Provide minority engineering and technical role models
- Develop a broad-based, long-term community commitment.

Since 1977, FAME has served more than 4000 students. More than 1000 students have successfully completed the program matriculating through from 7th - 12th grade. 99% of the students that complete the program go to college. 65% of FAME students pursue baccalaureate degrees in engineering or science related fields of study.

Our Activities Include;

- A summer enrichment program
- A school year enrichment and maintenance program
- College skills preparation and course selection workshops
- First Robotics for middle school and high school students
- Student Council
- Etiquette and life skills workshops



Other Activities Include:

Test Awareness Workshops are offered for all students and aims to familiarize students with test taking techniques and procedures associated with standardized testing instruments such as the Scholastic Aptitude Test.

College Activities Seminars are held for Juniors and Seniors.

Peer counseling and role models to prepare younger students for more demanding phases of the program, i.e., the on-campus activities at the University of Delaware.

Job Readiness Training is designed to ease the transition from school to the working world for senior high school students who will be entering the summer employment phase.

Special Events are also offered throughout the year. These include tours of the supporting corporations, cultural events, social outings and more.
