HIV/AIDS AWARENESS ON THE FOOTBALL PITCH

In a bid to land as many balls as possible before the 2010 first ever African World Cup, in the hands of children who have never played with a real football before let alone owned one, Alive and Kicking Kenya initiated the 'Penalty Kick Challenge' over the month of July. Within this month, we went around various slum areas in Nairobi; Kibera (Olympic & Undugu), Kayole and Mukuru kwa Reuben, coaching children using special drills designed to inform them about HIV as well as teach them football skills.

In total, about 200 children directly took part in the challenge and got to learn a little about HIV; its prevention, how

it works, the truth about HIV/AIDS, and about available support and where to find it. Don't let the sport-based health education fool you though; it was fun all around, and a little bit of sweat and tact, especially during the penalty shoot outs where 87 children were able to outwit our goalie to take home their very own quality, repairable and durable leather footballs; balls that will benefit their greater communities due to the team nature of football. We hope to take the Penalty Kick Challenge out to more slum and rural areas around the country in November/ December.

PEPETA NA ARSENAL PROMOTION

On Thursday 13 August 2009 the "Pepeta na Arsenal" Promotion was launched at Braeburn Garden Estate with speeches from Terry Neill (former Arsenal player and manager), and the Guest of Honour, British High Commissioner Mr Rob Macaire. The competition which will run during the 2009/2010 football

season aims to reward arsenal fans in the country. It will entail answering simple questions on football and the Premier League via sms, for a chance to win one of 24 fully paid trips for two to the Emirates stadium where they will watch Arsenal home matches. Fans will also have chances to win branded Arsenal merchandise in weekly draws, among them Arsenal branded Alive & Kicking footballs. More to just winning trips and merchandise, the promotion which is being run by Terry Neill Sports Services LLP in partnership with SkyData Ltd, a Kenyan Premium Rates Service Provider, will also support A & K's initiative to land more balls in the hands of underpriviledged children in the country, develop sports and create health awareness.

EX-BRAZIL TEAM PLAYERS VISIT KENYA

Names like Silvio, Giovanni, and Paulo Sergio evoke memories of the golden Brazilian sides of the nineties. Most of us only watched these stars on tv but a select few
