The Artisans' Association of Cambodia (AAC) was formed in 2001 with a vision to promote a new approach to the socio-economic integration of landmine survivors and others with disabilities.

With the support of the World Rehabilitation Fund (WRF), the International Labour Organization (ILO) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP).

The Artisans' Association of Cambodia (AAC) is a Fair Trade association that supports over 40 handicraft groups across Cambodia who are very often working with some of the nation's most vulnerable people, including landmine victims, those living with HIV-AIDS, human trafficking victims and minority tribes people.

Since this time, both the vision of AAC and the groups that we work with has expanded – from 5 members working with disabled people to 42 members supporting not only disabled people but also vulnerable women, minority tribes people and those from especially poor backgrounds.

AAC is committed to helping these social enterprise develop their range of products – whether handicrafts, fashion accessories or homeware items – and ensure that buyers have the opportunity to purchase these unique items.

We are determined to see the benefits of trade, passed down to the people behind the products.

History & Philosophy

In Cambodia, victims of trafficking and sexual exploitation are among the most marginalized and social excluded groups in Cambodian society. Even after escaping from their oppressors, many women do not have support or skill to help them reintegrate in society. Afesip Fair Fashion aim is to correct this problem.

We've started our workshop in February, 2003 in Thloc Chrov, Kompong Cham province. With more than ten years of operation, we have helped more than hundreds women joining with our work.




