# **Who We Are**

Comprehensive Disaster Response Services (CDRS), registered since 2006 as a social welfare organization under Pakistan's Societies Act, was founded by relief worker musician and Todd Shea (recipient of Tamgha-i-Eisaar), After responding to the 2005 earthquake with a team of Pakistani American doctors. Ever since that time, CDRS has remained dedicated to providing quick, efficient, honest and compassionate medical and humanitarian relief during and after disasters. Our major humanitarian mission has served over 2 million citizens in Pakistan affected by the 2005 earthquake, the 2009 Swat IDPs crisis. the 2010 great flood and 2011 flooding in Sindh. CDRS responds remote disaster zones with doctors, food, supplies, medicines, funds. logistics, health education programs directly to the people who immediately need particularly it: mothers and children.



# **Recent Medical Camp Ventures of CDRS**

One of the most recent initiatives taken by CDRS is to provide free medical camps and health education to the less fortunate children of Pakistan. These medical camps are providing better healthcare and guidance to children who cannot afford basic health facilities.

The first camp was arranged in collaboration with Pehli Kiran School in Islamabad, which is also a social welfare society working in the education sector. The camp was a huge success as it treated more than 300 students with the help of our qualified doctors, volunteers, and our sponsors Pepsi and Nestle along with our media partners FM91.

After the success of the first camp, CDRS organized another one on 6 July, 2012 for another Pehli Kiran School, providing free checkups for more than 250 students of that community with the help of the same team....




