We hire lorries which brings water to the homes of our members . At home we have build water safety tanks.

Music Ministry

The albums are sold to support the needs of the family and has been bringing together many artists, during this kind of meetings we are able to share to the community members of how we can change our life styles by being involved in projects that will earn us some income.

In such meetings we have been able to address the cases of child rites abuse, sexual harassments and drug abuse. This has been a platform of preaching peace to our community members. This kind of events has brought together people from different tribes and as they interact we reduce tribalism headlines. Now tribes can intermarry, they can do business together and even support one another when needs arises.

Self Supporting Business

Our members have been encouraged to learn independent business such as Posho meals, shops, dairies and selling second hand clothes. Others are working as house maids.
