Data Overview

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
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1. Student Achievement

Chart 1 bellow illustrates the average results of the students in the Summer Academy. On the first assessment during the summer academy – the diagnostic assessment – students scored 47% on average. This assessment was used by the teachers to diagnose the starting level of their students. After that first assessment, they administered daily quizzes after each lesson to assess how much the students understood the new material. Throughout the three weeks the average grade on the daily assessments was 70%. In the middle of the Summer Academy, the teachers administered mid SA assessment to check if the students are mastering the material. On the last day of the Academy, teachers administered a final assessment, which focused on the learning goals covered during the past week. The average grade on final assessment at the end of the third week was 72%.



Because it is important for us to help every student to achieve success, in addition to the average subject mastery result we track their individual results. We track specifically the change in the percentage of students who are below 60% (equivalent of failing). The graph illustrates how during the 3 weeks of the Summer academy the proportion of students with results below 60% decreased with 20% - from 59% on the diagnostic assessment to 39% on the final assessment.






Table 1 illustrates the student achievement by age group. This year the Summer Academy was attended by 328 students from grades 1st through 11th.



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2. Student Feedback

We administered a mid-summer academy feedback survey to the students. A total of 834 surveys were received and the average score on all questions was 4.62 out of 5 with 91% desirable scores of all question responses . Table 2 on the next page is a summary of the highest and lowing scoring questions.

3. Parents Feedback

We also administered a feedback survey to parents after the end of the Summer Academy. The responses were very positive overall. The table below summarizes the results:

Below are shared some quotes from the parents' feedback:

4. Classroom observation data

During the Summer Academy, our teacher coordinators logged classroom observation data in priority areas for development. The charts below illustrate the distribution of teachers in the main three categories we track. The charts show how the distribution changed from week to week. Please note that the last week of the summer academy was devoted to visiting teachers who are struggling, thus we can see a slight increase in the percent teachers rated with lower scores.
