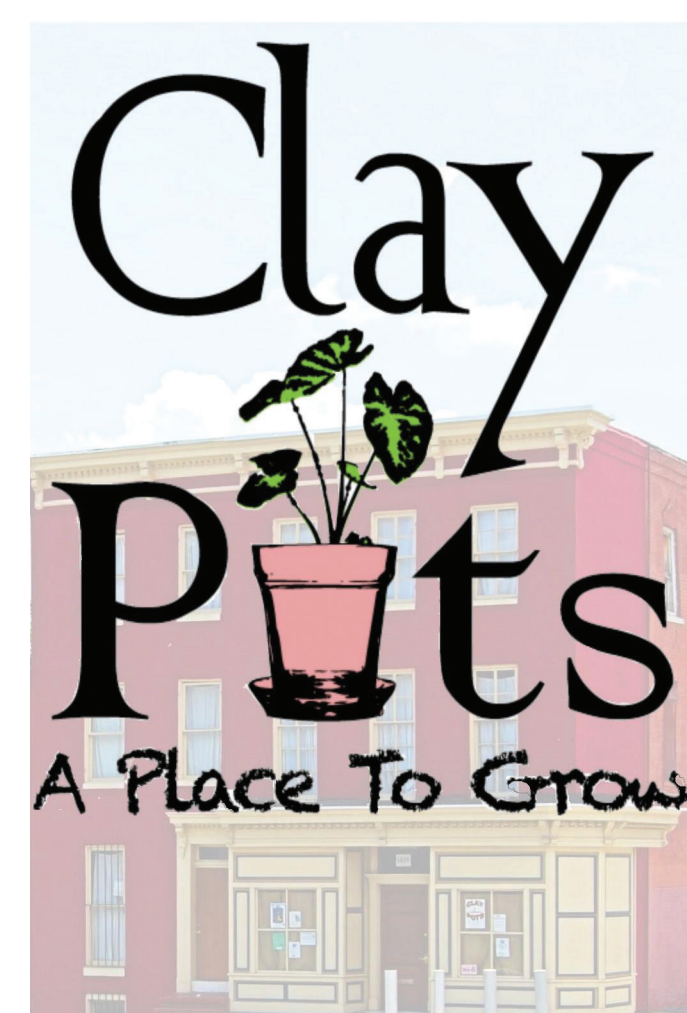
FACTS ABOUT CLAY POTS GED PROGRAM AND COMPUTER LAB PROJECT

- 400+ community residents have participated in the GED program.
- Each week Clay Pots offers classes to students at varying levels, including pre-GED.
- 50 students on average are enrolled each semester.
- 88% class retention rates.
- 32% of GED graduates go on to higher education.
- In 2014, the GED test became computerized.
- To address this change and ensure students succeed in this new format, Clay Pots is seeking funding of \$40,000 to expand and create a new computer lab.
