These four women, named above, told Alya many times that they liked Warm Hearth very much. We will bring them home *for good* within two days. We continue to work with the government to determine who else

we will welcome home (we have space for six other residents). I was overcome as I looked at the photographs of these four women poking around our home, seated on couches that are soon to be *theirs*, & sharing bread & cakes with our residents. Soon they will be *ours*. And in my heart, they already are. We belong to one another. I cannot believe that it is finally a season of such growth. My deep prayer is that these dear women will find growth & healing in our midst. Something so beautiful is also painful as it is an injustice that has brought them here. But it is mercy that they are now home.

pointed out, is that there is love in Warm Hearth. **And love names people.** In that naming, they become all they are to be. Susan spoke of being challenged to decide how she will see & name people. This is a responsibility we all have as we encounter the world. It is these seemingly small things that can transform life.
