



Education is important, but ACCESS to education is even more important!


Only of children in the poorest households have access to children's books.

30% of ethnic minority households reported that at least one child had dropped out of school before the completion.


Only 36% of children from the poorest families attend **pre-school**.

Narrow the Gap 2013 Focus on Children



Clean Water Tower

1st Place - Ceporer Hoc Mon Grant of VND 150,000,000

Ceporer Hoc Mon used the grant to build a clean water tower that helps improve the quality of life for 161 children (80 families) living in Long Thuan (Long An), where the existing water source has been contaminated by alum.

2nd Place: Nhan Ai Social Work Club Grant of VND 100.000.000

Nhan Ai is offering life skills training and psychological counseling to disadvantaged children in poverty stricken areas of HCMC. The project aims to help children acquire basic knowledge and life skills that can change their behaviors, attitudes, actions and, ultimately, their futures. The project team also hopes to raise awareness about the challenges these children face among community members and

E-Books for Visually Impaired Children

3rd Place The Center for Multilanguage Database Kim Tu Dien (KMDC) Grant of VND 50,000,000

KMDC is using the funds to introduce a Let's Learn e-book for visually impaired children at shelters, clubs and schools in HCMC. The project aims to improve the English learning environment for these children, thereby empowering them to seek better education and career opportunities in the future.

Narrow the Gap 2012 Focus on Women



Goal: To reduce incidences of domestic violence among deaf women living in disadvantaged situations

Grantee: **Deaf Community Association of HCMC**

A grant of VND 139,500,000 to DCOH resulted in:

- · 105 deaf women and 122 deaf men
- 180 training sessions offering life skills, skills to prevent violence, sign language and other activities over the course of nine months, from January to September 2013.

Goal: Offer microcredit and support services to women living in slum areas in Binh Thanh, Go Vap and District 8 in HCMC



Grantee: Tinh Than Network

With a grant of VND 100,000,000, the Chi Hai project helped:

- 4 women pay off their debts to loan sharks
- 91 women were able to purchase working tools, stalls, bicycles, or make other investments into their existing small businesses.
- 70 women were able to pay of their first loan.
- Training sessions for 24 network members on household finances.
- Peer sharing, among 164 women on household financial management.
 Women in the network have gained financial
- independence improved status within their families and broader social networks.



Goal: Empower young girls through life skills training

Grantee: Khanh Hoi Orphanage
With a grant of VND 50 000 000 th

With a grant of VND 50,000,000, the orphanage offered:

- 12 sessions for 105 orphans on hygiene, health and reproductive health, communication and teamwork skills, and physiological issues relating to puberty.
- 2 sessions for 20 parents/caregivers.
- After the sessions, children said they felt more confident, open and knowledgeable about how to protect themselves from harassmant.
 - After the sessions, caregivers said they felt better equipped to provide care and guidance to their teenage


