



Speech-Language Pathologists Graduate Students August 9-16, 2014

A hands-on opportunity for speech-language pathologists and graduate students to enhance skills working directly with school-age youth who stutter, while under the guidance of recognized experts in the area of fluency disorders.

Training applies Basic Principle Problem Solving, a way of “clinical thinking,” focused on individual needs, positive relationships, and evidenced based practices during the therapeutic process.



Trainees participate in two days of lecture, discussion, and planning prior to camper arrival. Small and large group interactions with campers and participants occur in both structured and naturalistic contexts, under the guidance of Board Recognized Fluency Specialists, Kristin Chmela, June Campbell and Dr. Kevin Eldridge.

Youth with fluency challenges attend an overnight therapy program held at a recreational camp setting.

Individualized communication goals are addressed during individual, small

and large group interactions throughout the camp experience.

Recreational activities include swimming, boating, games, ropes course, climbing wall, crafts, archery, campfires and more.

Leader-in-Training Program, for teens who stutter entering grades 10-12 is available by application.

Parents and guardians attend arrival and departure day programs designed to enhance their camper's experience at Camp Shout Out and foster continued progress.
