ow many pet birds are abandoned by their owners each year? The precise answer is: *no one knows*. The heartbreaking answer is: *too many*. Each year, thousands of birds are discarded by their owners left behind at a vet's office, abandoned at a shelter, or simply moved to the garage to live out their lives in a cramped cage with inadequate food, unclean water, and without any interaction with the humans who once promised to love and care for them.

Companion Bird Rescue *ickaboo* Companion Bird Rescue rescues birds and conducts bird care classes. That's all we do, and we do it with an all-volunteer staff. Every penny that is donated to us is used to help birds. More than 95% of our funds go toward paying our veterinarian bills.

*Mickaboo* takes in birds from animal shelters, cares for the ill and injured members of the San Francisco wild parrot flock, and accepts birds from owners who are unable or unwilling to continue to care for them. Every bird we rescue—from finches to macaws—gets the medical care it needs and deserves. We work with avian veterinarians to treat injuries, resolve illnesses, reverse the effects of neglect, and accommodate special needs. *Mickaboo* never euthanizes birds unless they are suffering without the possibility of recovery. When necessary, we provide hospice care for birds with terminal illnesses.

*Mickaboo* does not have a central office or bird care facility, but instead is composed of an extensive network of foster homes throughout Northern California. This helps us keep overhead costs to a minimum, enabling us to use virtually all of our contributions for direct care of the birds we rescue.

*Mickaboo* was founded in 1996 by two friends, one with a cockatiel named Mick and one with a 'tiel named Aboo. Since then, the organization has educated hundreds of people who care for birds, and has rescued more than 1,000 birds.
