



Women's Resource Center (WRC) is run by Cambodian women and primarily seeks to empower other Cambodian women. We provide emotional support, information, referral services and informal education workshops at our center.

However, we hope to tackle the current culture of silence and stigma around education for women and girls by directly advocating for women's rights and gender equality in the community.

VILLAGE WORKSHOPS

Working with Commune and Village Chiefs, we run informal education workshops in the villages that address community needs and struggles.

Village workshops are a great way to extend our support beyond our center and ensure both community leaders and parents, especially mothers, pass on good habits to their children.

Topics include: safe migration, domestic violence awareness, alcohol awareness, women's health, parent talks (positive parenting), gender roles (equity and equality), and financial literacy.

Topics are chosen depending on the needs and struggles of that particular commune or village. This information is found through community research.

SCHOOL WORKSHOPS

We partner with local secondary schools to provide basic education to Grade 8 and 9 students. Topics for the boys and girls include:

Alcohol awareness: what is alcohol and what are its physical, emotional and behavioral impacts; alcohol and responsibilities; how to say no to peer pressure; and how to seek support.

Domestic violence: what is domestic violence and its impact; what are healthy and unhealthy relationships; safety planning and seeking support.

Gender roles (equity and equality): understanding the definition of sex and gender, gender expectations in Cambodia for men and women with examples; what is gender equity and equality; and how to raise gender equality.

Multimedia: basic understanding of how to use multimedia platforms and how to protect against cyber bullies and predators.

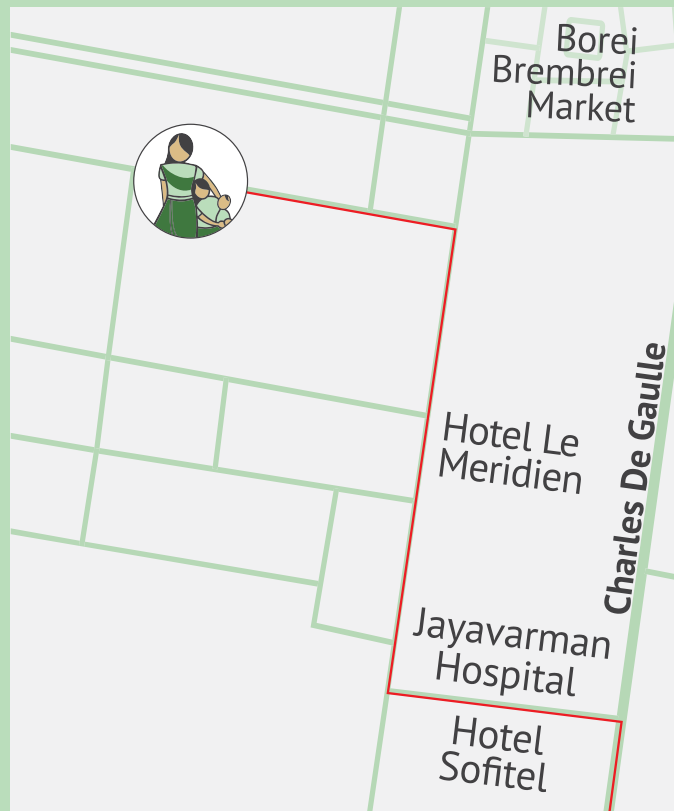
IN-CENTER WORKSHOPS

Our drop-in center offers a safe place for women to share their concerns and ask questions about all aspects of life. They also receive free referrals to many of the services available to women in Siem Reap.

In a typical year, we conduct more than 120 in-center educational workshop sessions with 8-10 participants. Topics include: women's health, 'rirel change' financial literacy, "parent talks" (positive parenting), women's rights and gender, and multimedia skills.

Our woman tuk tuk driver will take participants and their children to and from our drop-in center and in-center workshops. We also offer childcare services for participants that have no choice but to bring their children.

All of these services are free.
