

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## WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

RSKS India understands that only by making empowerment a verdict, women can make their own presence in the male dominated society and can also lead the society. RSKS India successfully did the following projects for women empowerment this year:-

## STOP VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

Violence against women (VAW) is one of the most undesirable forms of human rights violation. RSKS India is running many awareness activities/programs like workshops, puppet shows, camel cart shows, road rallies, posters making, story-telling etc under the Stop Violence Against Women in order to achieve a violence free society. This year, RSKS India organized the following activities under the HER VOICE campaign for Stop Violence Against Women:-

## **ACTIVITIES**

- · Workshop on Legal Rights of Women & Save Girl Child; Educate Girl Child in which more than 170 rural women and girls from 5 areas/locations different rural awareness.
- · Awareness workshop On Gender Equality with School Students in which 711 school children from 17 different schools got information on gender based violence through road rallies, poster competition, storytelling etc.
- RSKS India made 50 End Child Marriage awareness wall paintings at 10 different rural villages through which more than 2000 rural people got awareness about End Child Marriage.
- · Different types of activities like puppet show, camel cart awareness, peer to peer awareness, sand art awareness, my selfie awareness etc were organized at the International Pushkar Fair Through Which Thousands of people got awareness on Different Social Evils.









- · RSKS India organized Poster Competition On End Child Marriage program at 40 different schools and with 2002 school children. All the children were given 2000 pens, 2000 sketch colours, 2000 drawing sheets and 4000 chocolates after the competition and all the winners got 40 water bottles, 40 sketch drawing book and 40 geometry box.
- RSKS India organized Good Touch Bad Touch Awareness Camps at 15 different villages with 306 school girl children and explained them through the help of flipcharts, video shows, posters etc so that the school girls can understand it easily.



#### **IMPACTS**

- Rural Girls & women got to know about their legal rights and they all understood the importance of saving girl child and educating girl child.
- School children got to understand about the Gender Equality and they all took oath to contribute their part towards gender just society.
- End Child Marriage Awareness wall paintings provided concrete message to everyone whether it is a boy, girl, women, men, passerby or elderly people.
- These women and girls spread awareness to other women and girls and acted as someone's savior.
- Thousands of tourists, foreigners, local people got to know about the social evils and they all supported Violence Free Society.
- Thousands of school students and their family members got awareness on adverse effects of child marriage.
- · Hundreds of school girl children could now protect themselves from a bad touch.
- · A small change in the rural communities was seen after the intervention of RSKS India.
- Self Dependence, Confidence & leadership was built up in these women and girls after the intervention of RSKS India.

## WOMEN SELF HELP GROUP

It is always better to work in groups as Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much. In this context, RSKS India formed 20 Self Help Groups throughout the year and mobilized around 200 women through these groups and provided them 1,25,00,000 crore of low interest loan so that they can start their self employment and also to work collectively to fight against the problems they face in their area.





More than 250 women self help groups of RSKS India are running currently which are mobilizing around 2700 rural women and supporting them in their livelihood and also taught them about banking activities in order to create a financially literate groups. These self help group women have started their own self employment in both farming (Azolla farming, kitchen garden, vermin compost etc) as well as non-farming sector (like cattle husbandry, fish husbandry, vegetable shop etc) through the micro loans provided by RSKS India.

- These women are now involved in the family decisions.
- These women became economically stable and now support their family financially.
- 90% of these women went to the SHG bank every month.
- All of these women are doing their self employment/business.
- Rural women are working in farming and non farming sector.
- · Women of SHG groups became self reliant.
- 100% of these women now know about the banking activities.
- These women now look after each other & support each other.
- These women became role models for the society and it helped in changing the conservative mindset of the rural community.

## CAPACITY BUILDING, LIFE SKILLS AND

## > LEADERSHIP TRAINING

Capacity building, life skills & leadership training is a must for every rural women and girls as it encourages them and improves their verbal as well as mental skills. RSKS India conducted Two Days Capacity Building & Life Skills education training for 154 women self help group members at 12 different rural villages. In this training, these self help group women learned about the capacity building, life skills & leadership through different types of games, tasks, activities and lessons. All the women were made self aware that how they could bring a change in the society by being leaders. Through this training, the ability of women along with their knowledge has increased which resulted in increase in their confidence level. Also these women of SHG's were able to speak up their ideas in front of their family members. Now these SHG women are able to run their own employment better as well as they are increasing their livelihood resources.

- Rural women have got strength to speak up their ideas in their family & community.
- These women now act as leaders in the society.
- The participation of women in government and village programs has been increased.
- · Knowledge of these women had increased which makes them more powerful.
- Now these women can solve their problems and are not dependent on others.
- These women are now able to express themselves in a better way.
- · Confidence & courage of these women increased.
- Social and economic status of women in the family and society has been improved.





Education is such a powerful weapon that it can change the whole world. In India because of male dominated society, education for girl child is as important as medicine for a patient. Education is very important for creation of well developed society. RSKS India understands the importance of education and did the following programs throughout the year:-

# PATHSHALA: A VALUE BASED EDUCATION SCHOOL

Pathshala Schools of RSKS India provided value based education to 90 marginalized adolescent girls (10-19 years old) and 40 tween/middle childhood girls (6-14 years old) of far away inaccessible rural areas. Through this project, approx 130 girls of 3 remote rural areas were empowered through the weapon of education. These girls were school dropout, school going or illiterate.

Along with education, knowledge of good touch - bad touch, sexual and reproductive health, science models were also given to these adolescent girls and tween/middle childhood girls. They were also taught life skill training, leadership training, capacity building training, sports, discipline, moral values etc.

Totally we can say that this project empowered these adolescent girls and tween/middle childhood girls and made them all-rounder in order to connect them with the mainstream of education. In today's time, value based education is very important and this project helped these girls in surviving in this competitive world. In this school all the festivals were celebrated with full enthusiasm and all the girls participated in all the programs. Also the parents of these girls were very happy with the school and also attended all the parent teachers meetings and programs of the school.









- Mental & physical health of the rural girls increased through yoga, meditation, course education etc.
- Improvement was seen in the education level of the girls.
- Approx 130 rural girls got valued based education at their own village.
- Rural girls were very happy while celebrating all the festivals and social days.
- The girls who were irregular at school started going regularly at the schools.
- Girls won many prizes and academic achievements.



#### **IMPACTS**

- · These girls performed well in their schools.
- · These girls did not had to leave the school due to lack of education materials.
- · Parents of these children started supporting them in their education.
- Strong Education Awareness Message was conveyed in the villages.
- · More than 90% of these girls got excellent marks in their exams.
- These girls have got their educational right.

## **EDUCATION FOR EVERY GIRL**

There is enough evidence on why girls' education is important in Rajasthan as many girls are illiterate or school dropout and the major reason behind this is the poor financial condition of the family and the covid second wave made this situation more worse. The Education For Every Girl is an initiative of RSKS India to encourage girl child education at the rural level through different types of intervention. This year, RSKS India supported 1350 girl children of 89 different location/villages under the Education For Every Girl project.

These girls belonged from the families of rural farmers, daily wages labour, masons, truck drivers, marginalized community etc. These girls were identified by principal of school, school administration, village official and RSKS Team members through the baseline survey. RSKS India's intervention to encourage these girls education at the rural level was by providing these girls education material stuff (school bag, geometry box, stationery kit etc.), hygiene kit (handkerchief, soaps, sanitary napkin etc), food packets, school fees, school dress, water bottles, school sweaters etc. These girls were also taught about the social evils and the importance of education. This project provided a year's educational & hygiene requirements of these girls and supported and encouraged their family in girl child education during and after the second wave of Covid-19.





## SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD

Economic and social empowerment puts disabled, women and girls in a stronger position and gives them the agency to make decisions that promote their own health and wellbeing, as well as that of their families. RSKS India works to dismantle the economic and societal barriers that have placed women, disabled & girls on the periphery of society and was able to do following programs successfully throughout the year:-

# BUILD BRIGHT FUTURE FOR MARGINALIZED GIRLS & WOMEN

In today's time, skills are required to start your own employment or to get a job. The pandemic snatched away the jobs of many people and especially of the rural people as most of them who were going on a job of daily wages labour, masons, painters etc were sitting at home due to the lockdown in the second wave and the women and girls living at home were not able to support them. At this crucial situation, RSKS India was determined to provide non agricultural skills (beautician, handicraft, advanced garment making etc) training to the women and girls of the rural, urban rural areas.

This year, RSKS India successfully made 312 women and girls self reliant. These 18-35 years old girls & women belonged from 10 different rural areas and were from 20 different batches of different trades like beautician, advanced garment making training etc. These Vocational Skill Educational School was for 3-5 Months depending on different trades and in any trade 5 Hours training for a day was mandatory. Total hours of intervention were 15,000 hours this year with the rural women and girls.



These skills were taught in both practically & theoretically to the girls and the best part of these training were the job fair, life skills training, capacity building training, hat bazaar, exhibitions, sports activities, etc were organized in the training to empower these girls and women truly and build up courage and confidence in them. Skill certificates were also given to them to honor them at the end of the training so that it would support them throughout their life in getting a job or starting their own employment. Mobilization of these groups gave stability to the project and skill net groups were formed of these girls and monthly meetings were taken so that they and RSKS team members could discuss about employment opportunities, problems, query etc.





## **IMPACTS**

- 312 girls and women learned the skills of beautician, garments making etc.
- 85% of these women became self reliant by doing starting self employment or doing job.
- Confidence & courage was built in these girls & women of doing business of their own.
- These women and girls work as a group and support each other.
- · All of these women and girls are now supporting their family financially.
- These women and girls have become entrepreneurs and are not dependent on anyone financially.

# LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT TO PEOPLE WITH DISABILITY

People with disability are not like others, they have to work very hard in order to earn for their livelihood. Many people with disability living in the rural areas find employment very difficult as in rural areas employment opportunities for disabled people are not very much. In this context, RSKS India gave a helping hand to the people with disability by providing them employment opportunity at their own village.

RSKS India team members did door to door baseline survey and found out people with disabilities who could do some work and have a responsibility of their family nourishment. RSKS India provided immediate relief to a disabled living in a village and provided tyres repair shop materials like jack, hardware tools, tyre tubes, tyres, fevicol, banner, kaari, tubeless tyre kit etc and 2 goats for better livelihood and nutrition of the family members.



- Sustainable livelihood was provided to a disabled living in a village.
- Goats milk increased the physical capacity of the family and provided them better nutrition.
- Person with disability became a role model for other people and lives a respected life.
- A message that everyone should contribute their part to support people with disability was given in the village.
- The person with disability in now able to meet the family expenses and is sending all the children of the family to school.

## ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR GIRLS & YOUNG WOMEN

Entrepreneurship can tremendously help enhance the growth of an emerging economy like India. The pandemic had hampered economic progress by the restrictions and consequent unemployment, risk-aversion, and lowered consumption of non-essentials. The Girls & Young Women's Entrepreneurship Development program of RSKS India worked to empower 312 young women and girls of rural areas who were budding and existing women entrepreneurs who wanted to start, run and grow their business. RSKS India did this by sharing successful stories of women entrepreneurs, solving queries, addressing gendered imbalances in enterprise development in order to scale women entrepreneurs' contributions to growth and sustainable development and enabled their meaningful participation in entrepreneurship ecosystems. It empowered these girls & young women entrepreneurs, helped them to secure a decent job for themselves and for others and overcame the barriers to developing productive and sustainable businesses.

#### **IMPACTS**

- It built and moved towards more sustainable economies in the rural areas.
- It increased the participation of young women and girls in employment & entrepreneurship ecosystems.
- The financial condition of more than 90% of these girls who were present in the program increased.
- These women and girls became self reliant and they support their family.
- The confidence and courage of these women and girls have increased.
- These girls and women became role models to many other girls and women living in rural areas.













A person with disability is less likely to have access to rehabilitation, education, and employment, making it difficult for them to escape the vicious cycle of poverty. In this context, RSKS India worked for the disabled people on their Empowerment, Education, Livelihood, Social & Health through the following programs:-

# EMPOWERING PEOPLE LIVING WITH DISABILITIES

RSKS India is working to provide better life and opportunities to the people with disabilities. In this context, RSKS India is working with more than 450 people with disabilities and children with disabilities from around 16 villages of Ajmer. This program supports disabled of any age as they require special needs & attention. RSKS team took special care of the children with disabilities by doing home based activities and daily living activities with them in which the team taught different important things like learning about colours, combing hair, bathing, eating food, counting etc. This program worked on Empowerment, Education, Livelihood, Social & Health of the disabled people and this year the team was able to do the following work and their impact are as follows:-





## HEALTH

- Home based activity and Activity of daily living was done with 17/35 CwDs in which their families also participated.
- 12 PwDs who had many difficulties related to mobility were taught by home based activities which helped them a lot.
- 21/35 parents of CwDs were told about the cleanliness and things to do every day.
- Functional ability was taught to 12/35 CWD's in order to teach them self care.
- 3 CwDs who were malnourished were given nutritious food with the support of Anganwadi workers.



## **EDUCATION**

- Educational teachings of touch, shape, counting were taught to 11/35 CwDs.
- Volunteers at different schools supported CwDs in their education, so that they would not feel alone.
- Meetings were conducted with 16 School teachers to provide Educational Support for School going CWDs.
- Conducted 2 Mother Supporting Group monthly meeting.



## LIVELIHOOD

- 9 PwD's were taught about sewing in past were motivated and now they are earning for their living.
- Aadhar card and Jan Aadhar card were made of 16 disabled people.
- Disable Certificate /UDID cards were made of 15 disabled people and also application for disabled pension was given.
- Two disabled girl learned sewing by joining skill development training. Along with this, they were also trained in capacity building and life skills which increased their confidence.
- Special job cards were made of 6 disabled people.
- · Disabled pension were made of 9 disabled people.



## SOCIAL

- 32 PwDs were motivated through regular counseling and now they are freely participating in social and family activities.
- 29 PwDs were encouraged to take their own decisions and convey their own message to the society.
- Monthly meetings were taken of more than 8 DPOs (Disabled People Organization) every month.



## **EMPOWERMENT**

- At the panchayat level, disabled people were also involved and their thoughts were heard.
- · Information about govt. schemes were shared in DPOs monthly meetings.
- RPWD Act was shared with PwDs to make them aware of their rights.
- Disabled people were encouraged to ask for their rights and follow up of enquires done by them at different departments was done.





# WARM TRACKSUIT, WOOLEN CAP & WARM HAND GLOVES DISTRIBUTION TO CWDS AND AWARENESS ABOUT HEALTH & EDUCATION DURING WINTER PROGRAM

Everyone must wear proper clothes in order to protect themselves from the harsh winter breeze. There were some CwDs who were not having proper winter clothes to protect themselves from the harsh winter because of their family's poor economical condition. RSKS India intervened in this situation by providing Warm Tracksuits, Woolen Caps & Warm Hand Gloves to 50 Disabled Children of 15 different rural areas. Parents as well as the CwDs were also taught about their better health & education during winter through different activities. This program gave a sense of belongingness to the parents and CwDs as they had someone who is taking care of them when they needed it the most. These Warm Tracksuits, Woolen Caps & Warm Hand Gloves were able to protect these CwDs from the harsh winter and all of them got very happy.





## **IMPACTS**

- · Children with Disability got warmness in the winter.
- These children were not sick in the winter due to proper clothes.
- These children had the moments of happiness.
- Parents of these children took well care through these winter clothes.
- CwDs got awareness on health & education and now they and their parents will also look after their health & education more precisely







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## **ENVIRONMENT &**

## **SANITATION**



As every living creature on this planet depends on nature for sustenance, environmental protection has become more important than ever before. RSKS India did the following activities throughout the year to protect our environment and make world a better place to live:-

## SAVE INNOCENT SPARROW BIRDS

In today's time, innocent sparrow birds are lost somewhere and in some areas they are near to extinction. It is happening due to deforestation, mobile towers, pesticides and cemented houses as they are not providing them to live them in their natural habitat. To solve all these problems and increase the population of sparrow birds, RSKS INDIA this year did mass awareness about the benefits of saving sparrow birds for the environment was spread to around 200 people. Along with this, more than 45 eco-friendly bird houses & bird feeders were installed at public places or were given to bird lovers & environment lovers.













- · These eco-friendly bird houses are now home to more than 130 sparrow birds.
- Within 1-2 weeks the sparrow birds built their home at these bird houses.
- Increase was seen in the population of the sparrow birds.
- · Sparrow birds were protected from other hunters through the wooden bird house.
- · Birds got food to eat nearby through the bird feeders.
- Many new bird lovers approached RSKS India for having bird houses.

# ADOPT A TREE: PROTECT ENVIRONMENT & EARTH

Covid-19 and the lockdown gave a chance to the environment to recover as lockdown was imposed all over the different cities & villages and the people got to understand about the importance of trees as oxygen was the most important in the second wave of covid-19. We cannot think of life without environment. This year RSKS India went to 23 rural villages/locations and taught/aware more than 450 people about protection our environment by Adopting trees. This awareness work was done through flipcharts, story sessions, video sessions, flipbooks, card sheets etc. After this, RSKS India planted approx 900 fruitful and shady trees with the support of these people and contributed a part towards environment & encouraged other village people too to contribute their part too. These fruitful & shady trees will not only provide them shade, oxygen, business opportunities but will also help them in having better nutrition and better future for their children.













- · A small contribution was made towards protection of the environment.
- These fruitful & shady trees in the courtyard of people will provide fresh & clean air to family members.
- These people will have business opportunities & better nutrition through the fruitful trees.
- These people took oath to always plant & protect a tree each year.
- Other rural people also started adopting & planting trees.
- Steps towards better future for the next generation were taken.



There are numerous children who never got a childhood to enjoy. They belong from the poor strata of the society also known as slums or streets. RSKS India worked for the happiness of these children by Make A Wish For Street & Slum Children Project throughout the year and organized the following programs:-



# FESTIVALS CELEBRATION WITH SLUM 8 STREET CHILDREN

Slum & street children have a desire to celebrate the festivals like the other children from the mainstream of society celebrate but due to many reasons they are not able to. RSKS India made the ardent desire of these children come true by celebrating Festival of Colours- Holi, Festival Remarking victory over evil- Dussehra, Festival Of Light- Diwali & festival celebrating the birth of Jesus- Christmas with them. In the celebration programs, more than 600 slum and street children of approx 20 locations got chance of celebrating the festivals like other children does. A total of 500 party wear dresses, 1200 food packets, 1200 sweet packets, 500 colour packets, 500 cracker packets, 60 soft toys, santa caps & hairbands, balloons etc made their celebration better. The sparkle in the eyes of these children was easily seen and they all celebrated the festival with joy and enthusiasm. RSKS India team also organized plays, workshops, story-telling sessions so that these children could also understand the story behind these festivals in an easy way. These parents of these slum & street children were mesmerized while watching the celebration programs and got tears of happiness in their eyes.





- Hundreds of slum & street children celebrated festivals like the mainstream of society child does.
- Hundreds of slum & street children got to know about the stories behind the festivals.
- · Light in the darkness was achieved through this program.
- Wave of Happiness was seen at the slum & street areas.
- These children & their parents had moments of happiness despite their condition.





Children living at slums are fond of new dresses as they wear torn out dresses. Also they get sick so often due to not having hygiene materials and nutritious food to eat. RSKS India under the Make A Wish For Street & Slum Children project organized the New Dresses, Hygiene Kit & Nutritious Food Awareness & Distribution Program for the street & slum children in which dreams of more than 600 slum and street children of more than 30 locations got fulfilled through 500 New Dresses (Anarkali suit, Jeans, Shirts etc.), 1000 cotton t-shirts, 500 bakery food packets, 1512 Nutritious Food Kit (Soyabean, Dalia, Moong Dal, Rajma, Whole Black Gram etc.) and 1012 Hygiene Kit (Big Bucket, Comb, Bathing Soap Set, Toothpaste, Toothbrush, Hair Oil Bottle, Bathing Mug Etc.). All of these programs were conducted while following all the covid-19 safety guidelines. This program made the slum and street children dancing and singing with joy. Also the awareness about nutrition & healthy diet was done through snake & ladder game, flipcharts, consultations, flipbook, story-telling etc activities.











- · Improvement in health of slum and street children.
- Adoption of better hygiene practices by the slum and street children and their parents.
- New feeling of positivity appeared in the slum and street children's mind by wearing new dresses.
- · More than 600 children got to ate healthy nutritious diet.
- Slum and street children and their parents got to know about healthy nutritious diet.



# WARM TRACKSUIT, WOOLEN CAP, WARM HAND GLOVES & DELICIOUS FOOD PACKETS DISTRIBUTION TO STREET & SLUM CHILDREN AND AWARENESS PROGRAM ABOUT HEALTH & EDUCATION DURING WINTER

It is seen that the children living at the slum/street do not have proper clothes to wear in winter or summer or in rainy season. They roam daily with their tore dress and do work at shops, collecting garbage, selling tea etc. In this context, RSKS India intervened with 600 slum and street children of 24 slum & street locations and then awareness on their health & education was spread to them through snake & ladder game, flipcharts, card sheets, flipbooks etc. After this, they were told to maintain social distancing and then 600 Warm Tracksuits, 600 Woolen Caps, 1200 Warm Hand Gloves & 600 Delicious Food Packets (cream rolls, swiss rolls, chocolates, muffins etc) were delivered to these children to protect them from the harsh winter by providing them warm clothes.





- 600 slum & street children got protection against the harsh winter.
- These children got to understand about their health & need of education.
- These slum & street children got delicious food packets to eat.
- Most of the children did not fall sick this year due to proper warm clothes.
- No financial burden was on parents to provide winter dress to the children.
- This program helped in the mental as well as better physical growth.




## **DISCIPLINE & SACRAMENT CAMPS**

Burglary, theft, use of abusive language etc are common for the slum and street children. This happens due to NO education of discipline & sacraments. This year, RSKS India conducted Discipline & Sacrament Camps at 14 different slum & street areas where these type of incidences were happening. In these camps, more than 380 slum and street children participated and then they were taught through flipcharts, story-telling sessions, flipbooks, snake & ladder game, video shows etc. These children were motivated and were told to always respect their elders & learn to behave properly. In these camps, parents of the slum & street children brought their children and then information about ethical practices was told to the children.



- · Positive change in the habits of the slum and street children was observed.
- Slum & Street children started to respecting their elders and also started to greet them always.
- Many children took oath to never commit or indulge in any crime, theft, burglary etc bad activities.
- · These children learned about discipline, sacraments & moral values.
- · Ethical practices were adopted by the children.





## **HEALTH**



One among the numerous challenges in the healthcare sector in India has been the lack of access to quality services for the poor and marginalized communities. RSKS India is working successfully from the last 30 years to tackle this issue and this year RSKS team worked through the following ways to tackle the issues of health which people are facing at the ground level:-

# BE FREE: HAPPY PERIOD WITH SANITARY NAPKINS

Still in the twenty first century, there are so many rural, slum, street women and girls who are not using healthy practices during their menstruation which is causing them harm. RSKS India worked on habit change of these women and girls throughout the year and spread the awareness about healthy menstruation practices as well as distributed 50000 sanitary napkins to 2100 women & girls of 35 different locations/villages. RSKS India mobilized these girls & women during the pandemic by following all the covid-19 safety protocols and made them understood about sexual & reproductive health as well as healthy menstruation through the help of aprons, video stories, consultation, flipcharts, card sheets etc.

#### **IMPACTS**

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- Thousands of girls & women have adopted healthy hygiene practices.
- These women & girls received sanitary napkins at their own locality.
- · Habit change was observed in hundreds of women & girls.
- Use of sanitary napkins in their area got increased.
- Safe & healthy reproductive health practices have been adopted by these women & girls.









# NUTRITION FOOD PACKET DISTRIBUTION TO SERIOUS PATIENTS SUFFERING FROM T.B.

Tuberculosis is a life threatening disease however by having healthy diet and proper medications, one could easily get recover from it. This year, RSKS India supported 50 MDR & XDR tuberculosis patients in having proper protein rich nutritious food every month. RSKS India's nutrition food packets contained of soyabeans, eggs, rajma, oats, black gram etc. which are very healthy food and it helped these T.B. patients in a speedy recovery. These patients were the daily wages worker, labour, painter, marginal farmers, mine workers etc who were not able to have proper nutritious food due to poor financial condition of the family. RSKS India tracked them until they got recovered and provided healthy nutritious food to them.



#### **IMPACTS**

- Regular Intake of Protein rich diet made speedy recovery of these patients.
- Weight of these patients increased which made these patients healthy.
- · Their family did not lose a member.
- Poor financial condition did not become a hindrance in recovery from TB.
- These patients, family members got a huge support when they wanted it.



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## KILL MALARIA SAVE HUMAN LIFE

Every year many people around the world lose their life due to mosquito borne diseases. It happens due to people not being aware about the diseases as well as how to get protection from mosquitoes. RSKS India in this context organized Mass Awareness (Through Charts, Snake Ladder Game, Stories & Flipchart) Program About Prevention and Treatment of Mosquito-Borne Diseases & Mosquito Net Distribution To Street, Slum & Nomadic Families Program in which 400 Families and around 1600 family members of 17 different slum and street locations got benefitted. A total of 400 Mosquito nets were provided to these nomadic families. Prevention & treatment from mosquito borne diseases were also told to these people so that they could protect themselves and their family members from the life threatening diseases caused due to mosquitoes.

- Thousands of nomadic, slum & street people got protection from the mosquito borne diseases.
- Someone's life was being saved through this program.
- · Cleanliness was adopted by the families living at the slum & streets.
- · These families now do not let water to lodge nearby their huts.







# WARM BLANKET DISTRIBUTION TO STREET, NOMADIC, POOR PEOPLE DURING WINTER

In the harsh winter and cold breeze, there are people who live on streets or roads, these people are homeless, nomadic or poor. In the winters, due to the cold weather these people get sick due to it still their poor financial condition does not enable them to have anything to fight against the winter. RSKS India through the Warm Blanket Distribution To Poor, Street And Nomadic People During Winter program provided warmness to 320 homeless, poor, street and nomadic people of 7 different locations. These warm blankets were given to them so that they will be able to tackle the cold weather and protect themselves from getting sick.







#### **IMPACTS**

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- · These people got protection and warmness during the winters.
- · These people did were not sick as they covered themselves with the warm blankets.
- These people didn't have to beg in front of anyone for the warm blanket.
- · They believed in humanity due to this noble support.
- · Hundreds of lives were being saved from the harsh winter.

# NUTRITIOUS FOOD STUFF, HYGIENE KIT & AWARENESS ABOUT HEALTHY DIET FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN

There are many school going children who often fall sick due to non hygienic practices and malnutrition. RSKS India in this context, started Nutritious Food Stuff & Hygiene Kit And Awareness About Healthy Diet For School Children program this year through which 201 students of 14 different schools were identified through baseline & then Nutritious Food Kit (Soyabean, Dalia, Moong Dal, Rajma, Whole Black Gram etc) & Hygiene Kit (Big Bucket, Comb, Bathing Soap Set, Toothpaste, Toothbrush, Hair Oil Bottle, Bathing Mug Etc) were provided to these girls so that they could study more diligently. Also awareness about healthy diet was shared with them through the help of flipcharts, flipbooks, snake & ladder game etc awareness tools. Feedback of these children & parents were also taken after the implementation of the program for understanding & making better the quality of work.





#### **IMPACTS**

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- Hundreds of rural village children got awareness on healthy diet.
- Nutritious food security was being achieved of hundreds of children.
- Children got less sick after the started using hygiene kit.
- Students were more regular at the schools.
- All the school children took oath to always brush their teeth, comb their hairs, bath every day.

The campaign and advocacy is done to aware community people, while making the community a participant in celebrating the festivals or spreading awareness on any social topic and organizing different types of activities and spreading the importance of social day to the people. Agriculture sector has decreased over the past years and it is affecting the livelihood of many rural farmers. In this context, RSKS India did the following work to ensure support to Agriculture & Livestock:-

# ANIMAL HUSBANDRY & ORGANIC FERTILIZERS SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING

It is very important for a farmer to not depend up on any one source of income. They must seek out for different types of self employment in order to diversify their income source but it requires skills. RSKS India fulfilled their need of skill knowledge by organizing Two Days Animal Husbandry & Organic Fertilizers Skill Development Training with the women self help groups. In this training, these women were taught through flipcharts, video sessions, lectures etc so that they could understand the importance of Animal Husbandry & Organic Fertilizers for them. Through this program, RSKS India was able to teach and train 154 women self help group members of 11 different locations. Now these women are not dependent on any one source of income, they have diversified it and have become self reliant after learning these skills.

- Self help group women got awareness about animal husbandry & organic farming.
- These women have diversified their income source.
- These women are able to support their family financially.
- These women are now not vulnerable in different seasons.
- So many rural people are now adapting organic fertilizers for farming.
- Income generation of the rural families had been increased.







## 

Whole world faced the havoc created by the novel corona virus. Many people lost their livelihood, their lives, their hopes and the economy took a big shook. In order to restrict the increasing COVID cases and prevent the fatalities from taking place amid the deadly second wave, RSKS India team planned and executed the following programs under the Together We Can 2.0 Campaign & the Covid-19 Humanitarian Relief Project to protect & aware the people from the novel corona virus:-

# RATION/GROCERY PACKETS & HYGIENE KIT DISTRIBUTION TO NEEDY FAMILIES

Food is one of the most important basic needs of any person. There were so many people who lost their employment due to covid-19 and then their savings were also vanished which led to food security problems. RSKS India found out these people from different villages, slums, streets etc and provided happiness to them in the form of Ration/Grocery Packets & Hygiene Kit. RSKS India in total provided food relief to more than 6,700 families which ensured the food security of approx 27,000 family members living at more than 200 different Rural villages/location with 2,16,608 Kg of Ration/Grocery. Hygiene Kit contained Sanitary Napkin Packets, Sanitizers, Vitamin-C Tablet Packets, Soaps, Masks Etc. which helped these people in building strong wall of safety from Novel Corona Virus. A total of approx 67,000 sanitary napkins, 13,500 sanitizers, 27,000 reusable safety cloth masks, 13500 Vitamin-C Tablets, 27,000 soaps were endowed by RSKS India. This was a humanitarian effort of RSKS India which resulted in comfort of Thousands of Lives with proper Nutrition & Hygiene.





















## FREE FOOD ARRANGEMENTS FOR COVID-19 **PATIENTS**

There were many covid-19 patients at home due to full hospitals in the second wave. These people were someone's mother and father etc and these people had to isolate themselves from the other members of the family in order to protect them from getting covid-19 virus. In this context, RSKS India organized Free Food Arrangements For Covid-19 patients program. In this program, 73 food packets were given to 9 covid-19 patients at 3 different locations. This secured the food security of the family and the risk of spreading of corona virus among the family members also got reduced. The Covid-19 patients were able to isolate themselves from the family members without getting worried of how the food for the family will be made.









## **EDUCATION STUFF SUPPORT TO NEEDY GIRLS**

During the second wave, the schools were closed from about last 1.5 years and the rural people lost their employment source and this lead to so many problems like the girl children were unable to go to school due to short dress and small shoes. When RSKS India came to know about this situation then urgent relief work was done through Education Stuff Support To Needy Girls Program. In this program, 219 rural girls from 17 different locations/villages were identified and were provided school shoes and school dress. This program, gave these girls a Motivation to come to school and get education as well as it also made them understand that someone is with them in this harsh situation and humanity is still alive.















## COOKED FOOD RELIEF PROGRAM

RSKS India intervened for the food of poor and needy people as due to covid-19 second wave many poor and needy people lost their employment and then they were struggling to have two times meal daily. Cooked Food Distribution Program For Needy People was started During Lockdown which supported approx 1441 needy & poor people at 30 different locations with cooked food like Puri/Chapati, Rice, Pulses, Salad, Sabzi etc. This cooked food distribution was continued throughout the second wave of Covid-19 so that no one sleeps hungry. It provided nutritious tasty meal to the poor and needy people. The people who were neglected by others were found by the RSKS India and immediate relief was provided to them.













# HYGIENE KIT DISTRIBUTION TO SELF HELP GROUP WOMEN & RURAL GIRLS

Covid-19 pandemic caused lockdown at different parts of the country and due to this the mobilization of resources/products was affected. In some rural areas, there was not even fulfillment of the basic need materials during covid-19 like soap, sanitizers, sanitary napkins, reusable safety masks etc. RSKS India fulfilled these important requirements of 539 self help group women of 31 different rural villages by providing them hygiene kit which contained soaps, sanitizers, vitamin-C tablets, reusable washable safety masks etc. These women and girls were able to protect themselves from the novel corona virus and they maintained their hygiene & health through these hygiene kits.







## **COVID-19 AWARENESS WALL PAINTINGS PROGRAM**

Second wave of covid-19 devastated the rural villages as lack of awareness in rural village was the cause of many deaths. This problem was being solved through the Covid-19 Awareness Wall Paintings Program of RSKS India in which oil wall paintings were made at different areas of the rural villages which raised awareness about the covid-19 safety precautions as well as the covid-19 vaccination to the rural people in an effective way. A total of 582 Covid-19 Awareness Oil Wall paintings were made at 95 different rural villages which raised awareness to about 19,000 rural village people. The Covid-19 infected cases in the villages reduced through this program and rural as well as the passerby people also got awareness through these wall paintings.











# MASS AWARENESS ABOUT COVID-19 SAFETY PROTOCOLS & VACCINATION

It is always said that precaution is better than cure but still people do not understand this. This could be easily seen during the pandemic that there were many people who were not wearing masks even in the rise of covid-19 cases and this was the reason why covid-19 cases were increasing in the villages too. There was a dire need to raise awareness about the safety measures which everyone must take in order to take precaution from covid-19 deadly virus. This need was understood by RSKS India, as we focused on spreading awareness about Covid-19 Safety Protocols & Vaccination to as much people as we can. We were successfully able to raise awareness to more than 30,000 people of more than 250 different locations/villages and provided reusable cloth safety masks to around 23,000 rural people, school children etc so that they could protect themselves and their family members from the deadly corona virus. From this program, we were able to decrease the spread of covid-19 in the rural area and were able to promote the Covid-19 Safety Protocols & Vaccination for better health of people.

# HYGIENE AND MEDICAL KIT DISTRIBUTION TO CORONA WARRIORS

Needless to say, doctors, nurses and people working in health-care sectors were particularly vulnerable to the highly infectious disease. In response to the global pandemic, the under-resourced doctors were facing unprecedented challenges. The sacrifice that they made for the safety and welfare of humanity is priceless and to support them in their battle against the pandemic, RSKS India started Hygiene and Medical Kit Distribution To Corona Warriors under which 25 Digital Blood Sugar Test Machines, 25 Blood Sugar Test Strips, 25 Nebulizer Machines, 25 Digital Blood Pressure Monitors, 99 Pulse Oximeters, 8210 Sanitizers (100 mL), 50 Sanitizers (200 mL), 83 Sanitizers (250 mL), 226 Sanitizers (500 mL), 500 Sanitizers (550 mL), 21500 Head Surgical Caps, 8150 N-95 Masks, 12595 Cloth Reusable Safety Masks, 150 PPE Kits, 35150 Surgical Masks, 24400 Examination Hand Gloves, 962 Face Shields and 100 Reusable Surgeon Apron/Gown were endowed to more than 200 PHC, CHC, Satellite and City Hospitals which benefitted more than 2000 corona warriors like doctors, nurses, sanitation workers etc working in hospitals. Through this medical and hygiene kit, these corona warriors were able to do treatment of thousands of patients.
