Since 1983, MADRE has partnered with community-based women's organizations to save lives, protect women's rights, create social change, and build safer, healthier communities.



2014

MADRE brings medicines, birthing kits and emergency supplies to women in Gaza trapped without power or access to hospitals during intense bombings.



2013

After chemical attacks kill and injure hundreds of civilians, MADRE delivers critical humanitarian aid to Syrian women and their families in Za'atari refugee camp in Jordan and provides counseling to women traumatized by the war.



2012

MADRE delivers medicines, wheelchairs and counseling to the forgotten people of Haweeja, Iraq, a village downstream from a US military munitions dump, where at least 855 children were born with birth defects and cancers.



2010

MADRE wins a groundbreaking legal victory to combat epidemic levels of rape in post-earthquake Haiti.

2009

MADRE organizes Sudan's first Women Farmers Union. Five thousand women organic farmers now have seeds, supplies and marketing skills. They're feeding their families and improving women's economic status.



2007

MADRE supports an underground escape network of women's shelters for Iraqi women fleeing "honor killings."

2005

MADRE meets emergency needs of women and families devastated by the Asian tsunami, Hurricane Katrina and the earthquake in Pakistan. MADRE advocates for reconstruction efforts that help strengthen women's capacity to respond to disasters.



2004

MADRE sends emergency humanitarian aid to women and families in refugee camps in Darfur, Sudan.

2002 MADRE sends a shipment of over \$2.5 million to our sister organization, CADAMUC, the only OB/ GYN clinic on the North Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua.

2000

MADRE heals the damage of the US Cuban embargo, sending \$700,000 in critical breast cancer screening equipment and medicines to the Cuban Red Cross.





1999

MADRE responds to the NATO bombings of Kosovo and Serbia by supporting programs for refugees and survivors of war-time rape.



1998

MADRE is the only organization to deliver food, fuel and medicines to 10 remote communities after Hurricane Mitch hits Nicaragua.

MADRE provides healthcare, counseling and peace-building programs for survivors of rape and genocide in Rwanda.

1997

MADRE provides Klinik Fanm, Haiti's first women's health clinic, with an on-site laboratory, and sends a shipment of medicines and supplies to three Haitian clinics.



1993

MADRE organizes a national tour to raise awareness of rape as a weapon of war, with women from Bosnia, Croatia, Serbia, South Africa, Nicaragua and other embattled countries.



1991 MADRE delivers 10 tons of milk and medicines to Iraqi women and families following the first Gulf War.

1987

MADRE supports 22 childcare centers and an orphanage in Nicaragua for children caught in the USsponsored Contra war.

1986

MADRE launches "Boycott South Africa, Not Nicaragua," bringing together students from South Africa, Namibia, Nicaragua and the US.

1983

Our founders partner with our Nicaraguan sisters to build an international women's organization, MADRE. We raise \$2 million for Nicaragua's first women's hospital.
