Message from the Board President Richard D. Rein



2013 marked an eventful year for us at the Center for Safety & Change as our esteemed Executive Director of 34 years, Carolyn Fish, announced her retirement. Under Carolyn's diligent leadership and guidance, the Center has grown from a 24-hour crisis hotline and a 15-bed emergency shelter for battered women and their children, to an organization that provides an array of multilingual, culturally sensitive residential and non-residential programs for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and to victims of all crimes, as well as cutting edge violence prevention programs.

While one in three women will tragically experience abuse from an intimate partner or will be sexually assaulted in her lifetime, help is available, 24/7, at multiple locations throughout Rockland County! This accomplishment is, in no small part, a direct result of the tireless effort of Carolyn Fish and her staff. Over the years, the Center has provided thousands of women and children a safe, healing and hopeful environment where they can find the strength and courage to face another day. Recognizing the need to bring critical issues out from the shadows, like domestic violence 35 years ago, Carolyn was instrumental in adding to the Center's focus in 2013 the issues of human sex trafficking of domestic minors, where the victims' average age of entry is 12 to 15 years old. Through Carolyn's excellent community building skills, she, along with Kiera Pollock, Deputy Executive Director, and other community leaders, created a countywide Task Force on Human Trafficking, which continues to raise awareness and has the ability to respond effectively when victims are identified.

We are fortunate that Carolyn is staying with us on a parttime basis throughout 2014 as the Executive Director Emerita and hope that you will join us in a special event to be held in 2015 celebrating her distinguished career. I am proud of the incredible work of Carolyn, as well as the board and staff of the Center and hope you will enjoy reading about our accomplishments in this 2013 annual report. Thank you for your support – we couldn't have done it without you!

Message from the Executive Director Emerita

As a founding member of the Board of Directors of the Center, then the Rockland Family Shelter, I have watched our programs flourish, helping more and more survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault, and their family members each year, while gathering support for our mission.

During these years I have been inspired by the courage and resilience of those whom we serve, and the commitment and intelligence of our staff and volunteers who work diligently on their behalf. Together we have built a vibrant organization that has become a national model in its compassionate, creative response to survivors and their family members and a leader in the movement to change the attitudes and beliefs that support violence against women and others who are oppressed.

Although I know our work is far from complete, 2014 is our 35th anniversary year, which seems like the right time for new leadership to guide the organization into the future. In the interim, before the new Executive Director is named, Michael Mandel and our trustworthy staff will ably hold the course. In the years to come, the Center for Safety & Change will continue to thrive and the lives of thousands of Rocklanders will have safer and brighter futures.

2013 Highlights, Awards & **New Appointments**

Highlights

The Center, led by the efforts of co-chairs of the STOP F.E.A.R. Coalition Hon. Harriet Cornell and Carolyn Fish, formed a Human Trafficking Task Force. The Task Force, now led by Kiera Pollock and Peter **Modafferi**, is composed of representatives from law enforcement as well as mental health and community leaders, who recognized the need for a coordinated community response due to the close proximity of Rockland County to the location of the 2014 Super Bowl and the associated high numbers of cases of human sex trafficking during events this size. Through several trainings, led by Carolyn Fish, Kiera Pollock and D.A. Tom Zugibe, the STOP F.E.A.R. Coalition and Human Trafficking Task Force created a new level of awareness about this issue in Rockland County.

Sergeant Chris Bray of the Phoenix Police Department and Eric Pauley from the FBI's Innocent Lost Project were featured speakers at the annual STOP F.E.A.R. Conference at RCC focusing on Human **Trafficking.** This training was part of a series of trainings leading up to the Super Bowl for the general public, including first responders and law enforcement, healthcare providers, the hotel industry, including the RBA Tourism and Hospitality Committee, transportation workers, utility workers, religious communities and others.



The Domestic Violence Workplace Committee met monthly and conducted trainings on domestic violence in the workplace for AFLAC representatives and Head Start employees.

To commemorate the **15th anniversary of V-Day**, an international campaign to end violence against women and girls, the Center organized a mega flash mob dance at the Palisades Mall on February 14. Over 500 people joined this event titled **Rockland Rising**, in the spirit of **One Billion Rising**, which was celebrated by activists around the globe.

The STOP F.E.A.R. Coalition and the Center for Safety & Change partnered with the **Adolph H. Schreiber Hebrew Academy of Rockland County** to present *Flowers Aren't Enough,* a play by Naomi Ackerman about a woman abused by her husband. The play was followed by a panel discussion.

The Center launched its **Decade of Prevention Campaign,** in support of its Teen Dating Violence Prevention Program and SAEDA (Student Activists Ending Dating Abuse), raising nearly \$200,000 in critical support. The Center held a special memorial service for past Deputy Director of Programs, Lynn Sheinkin, who passed away in August of 2012. In memory of her many contributions to the prevention of violence worldwide, the Center named its Department of Education the Lynn Sheinkin Department for Education and Social Change.







Awards & New Appointments

In January, **Kiera Pollock** was promoted to Deputy Executive Director of Programs and Clinical Services, where she oversees the Special Victims Program, including sexual trauma and comprehensive crime victims' services and the Lynn Sheinkin Department for Education and Social Change, as well as clinical programs.

In June, Venessia Defrank was promoted to Director of Residential Services.

In October, Executive Director, Carolyn Fish was honored by the Legal Aid Society for her continuing commitment to advocate for justice, social change and for speaking for those whose voices go unheard.

The Center for Safety & Change received the
Annual Partnership Award from the Mental Health
Association of Rockland County.

In November, the Rockland Development Council honored long-time board member and co-treasurer S. Lisa Hayes as Outstanding Philanthropist. More than 400 guests attended to celebrate the honorees.

Zoe Szmulewicz and Amanda Violetto both won the 2013 Art Poster Contest, created by Tracy Brosnan, Esq. of Mandel, Katz & Brosnan, LLP to engage students in raising awareness of violence against women and girls. We thank Tracy and MKB for their continued support of this project.

Message from the Executive Director



It is my privilege to have been asked by the board to serve as Executive Director of the Center for Safety & Change commencing in 2014, our 35th anniversary year. Running an agency like the Center for Safety & Change, whose mission is to end gender-based violence and provide services for survivors of domestic violence, sexual abuse and other crimes, is a difficult task. But that difficult task would be an impossible one without the Center's incredible staff and board members, many of whom have been with us since our earliest stages. That roster includes, of course, our Executive Director for our first 34 years (now *Executive Director Emerita*), Carolyn Fish.

Carolyn Fish has been an undeniable force in Rockland County, the Women's Movement and the Battered Women's Movement since the 1970's. Her accolades, awards and accomplishments are far too numerous to catalog here and, needless to say, it is both a scary and humbling task to follow in her footsteps. The foundation Carolyn has laid for the Center, which I now endeavor to build upon, is massive and strong; strong enough for me, as a man, to now engage other men to stand with me to end the violence we have perpetrated on women for far longer than any of us can possibly remember. This is one of my immediate goals, and it is one that I hope will engage our supporters.

Which brings me to a final note to our supporters, from those of you who are just joining us to those have been with us since our beginnings: the Center for Safety & Change would not be what it is today without you. Your donations have been and remain critical to support the myriad of services we provide to the community, and today we need those donations more than ever. But equally as important has been your commitment to our mission. Movements for change are not built in a vacuum, nor are the organizations that support them. We are constantly reminded that it took an entire community of tirelessly dedicated individuals to bring us to where we are today and it will take that same community to sustain us in the future.

Tina's Story

When Tina's boyfriend slammed the door shut to their bedroom and began sexually assaulting her, Tina was suddenly reminded of a dark chapter in her childhood where she was repeatedly raped by a family friend who was supposed to watch her while her mother was at work. Tina tried to break free from the hard grip of her boyfriend and begged him to stop. She didn't scream or fight back because her daughter was in the room next door and she didn't want to scare her.

Once her boyfriend left the house, Tina broke down into tears. It felt as though someone had pulled the carpet from under her feet; the carpet of safety and trust she so carefully crafted in her efforts to overcome the trauma from the abuse in her childhood, only to be faced with the same kind of violence from someone she thought cared for her.

After the assault, Tina went to Nyack Hospital, where she was examined by Tara, the Center's Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner. She also spoke with Jenny, a Center advocate, who helped her overcome her initial feelings of shame for having become involved with a man who had harmed her so much. She also learned from Jenny about her options and Jenny promised to assist her through any legal steps she decided to take, including accompanying her to the police and other places if necessary.

Over the next few months, Tina visited the **Center for Safety & Change** regularly, not only to be accompanied to her court appointments, but also to help her process the trauma of the boyfriend's assault with Jacqui, one of the trained sexual trauma therapists at the Center. Having her feelings validated in a safe environment also allowed Tina to open up about the abuse in her childhood.

Jacqui also encouraged Tina to attend the Center's weekly Support and Empowerment Groups, which helped her see that none of the violence she experienced was her fault and that she was not alone. Tina slowly began to see hope for herself and her daughter. Her biggest dream now is to become an advocate for women who experienced violence like her.



At the Center for Safety & Change,

we serve hundreds of survivors like Tina each year and it is through the support of friends and supporters that we are able to provide programs and services that help survivors overcome violence perpetrated against them.

While in shelter, advocates provided more than 900 accompaniments, advocated for shelter residents more than 4,800 times and developed, reviewed and refined resident safety plans 886 times. Shelter staff also provided information and referrals almost 4,000 times and provided direct service to the shelter residents more than 22,000 times, including counseling, child care, transportation, translation and other services.

Children's Services

The Director of Children Services worked with over 150 children and their families through the Center's Children's Services Program; as well as with 73 families through the Safe Parents/Safe Kids program, a collaboration with Rockland County Child Protective Services.

Center staff also collaborated with VCS to co-facilitate a mother's support group in Spanish on a regular basis, which was attended by over 400 women.

Non-Residential Domestic Violence Services

Non-residential advocates developed 2.654 safety plans for victims of domestic violence and advocated for them more than 11.000 times. Advocates also accompanied victims over 1.300 times, provided nearly 12.000 information and referrals and nearly 24,000 direct services to non-residential clients, which included counseling, child

care, transportation, translation and other services.

Sexual Trauma Services

Advocates in the Sexual Trauma Department worked with nearly 300

survivors of sexual assault, providing direct service well over 3,000 times, which included crisis intervention, supportive counseling and therapy.
