

Progress Reports Of JOLO NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL

Jolo National High School used to be facing the enduring problem of inadequate classroom, chairs, blackboard, textbook, athletic equipment and other facilities. It has been struggling just like the rest of the public secondary schools in town, to provide standard quality education putting together concerted efforts to build a better productive tausug youth. But the historically sluggish growth of the educational sector can be rooted to the poor economic growth of the country.

There are lots of needs but only few are being blessed, the Jolo National High School is fortunate to be given the blessing, to be one of the recipients of this Asia American initiative thru Mr. Albert Santoli which brought about change, transcending the struggling condition for our teachers and a haven of mental enjoyment for the students.

Volumes of books and all sorts of reading materials and up-to-date reference materials were also made available enabling the teachers and students alike to obtain various information and make their research works.

Enrolment in our school has remarkably increased because basic materials, equipment and facilities and other school supplies donated by Asia American initiative thru Mr. Albert Santoli made our school more responsive to the educational needs of the students. Blackboards, dozens of chairs were provided where our students could properly seats and take notes of their lectures. Unlike before they used to squat down the floor waiting for government sluggish aid and support. Athletic equipment were also given that enabled six of our athletes who were selected to compete to the regional meet and they were able to bring with them 15 gold medals and 5 silver medals in swimming. Out of the six athletes who were qualified in the regional meet, Five of them participated in the palorong pambansa 2005 last May.



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
