We are creating a sustainable garden with an environmental early year's learning school in it: growing children for a future. Located at Alamparai Village, about 100 kms south of Chennai in Coastal South India. The foundation cares for a particularly vulnerable group of children in an Indian community, providing learning opportunity beyond what is available.

The East West Overseas Aid Foundation (TEWOAF) is a volunteer-driven charitable foundation which aims to ease the suffering of poor and disadvantaged people overseas through a range of initiatives in health care, relief for 'children at risk', education, and community development.

The funds you contribute will go towards supporting:

- 1: Our community outreach programs to bring children-students from surrounding communities to our school to learn. We will do group environmental projects and explore the beautiful coastal environment.
- 2: Our 'computer bus' outreach program brings computer learning to surrounding communities which cannot afford hi-tech education.
- 3: Our planting projects for the shore and the gardens.
- 4: To build new classrooms and a community kitchen-dining building to provide school lunches and have community performances of projects, music and dance.
- 5: We will teach our teachers to provide a hands-on interactive learning environment.

The foundation has evolved to provide the following programs.

1. The Uluru Health Care Centre, located in the nearby Indian fishing village, seeing over 100 patients per day.

2. Community Health Outreach Programs, nurses journey to surrounding communities to address health issues.

3. Women's Centre, provides a space for local women to learn sewing and other trades.

4. The Uluru Children's Home provides care and support for orphaned and forgotten children. Present capacity is 100 with occupancy of 70 boys and girls.

5. The Uluru ECO Education School has been in operation for 2 years and now has 32 children and will grow by 30 children in each of the next 5 years.

6. Early Years Education Centre is the first double classroom to be built for the Early Years School children.

7. Computer Learning buses which provide computer training to surrounding communities.



8. Vicky Standish Computer Learning Centre providing computer training for local children and adults.

9. Environmental Centre, a garden and classroom centre for ecological learning and biological projects. Part of the overall school being created children from surrounding communities come to learn about their coastal environment and the stewardship needed to live in a harmonious manner.



The Uluru School is a non-profit school being developed around a curriculum of eco and project based learning with English as a core language. We are committed to creating an amazing empowering place where communities, teachers and students can begin life-long-learning.
